Camp Jean Nelson provides a unique experience that empowers young people to thrive while gaining necessary diabetes management skills. Nestled in the beautiful Rocky Mountain Foothills near Water Valley, Camp Jean Nelson has partnered with Kids Cancer Care Alberta's Camp Kindle since 2014. The camp spans 160 acres of scenic rolling hills, forests, and waterways, offering a serene environment for campers to experience traditional camp activities while providing caregivers piece of mind knowing our healthcare professionals and counsellors are their to support their diabetes needs.

Camp has been a second home for me since I was 9, as a diabetic child it has been an uphill battle finding spaces where I feel safe and included but that sense of safety and acceptance comes easily for me at Camp Jean Nelson.
