Last year, we hosted the **first Canadian Young Lions Retreat**, which **empowered 33 Young Lions and Leos from across Canada** through a weekend of leadership development and service in Woodstock, Ontario. Participants had the chance to attend three workshops: one on youth advocacy, one on leadership and another on youth opportunities within the Lions. We also participated in a service project with the Ronald McDonald House, hosted a career networking event, and allowed participants to provide feedback to Lions Clubs International through a focus group.
