Saturday will not only feature our memorial service, business session and nominations of our future leaders, it will also showcase 2 service projects a Steps Walk and packing 250 snack bags for Ronald McDonald House. Our Luncheon speaker will be Tracy Kronk from Sufficient Grace. Our day ends with the Grand Banquet. I look forward to seeing you there.

State Convention: May 19-20th at the Columbus Northwest Marriott Hotel at Tuttle Mall. The guests for the weekend will be 1st Vice President Dr. Patti Hill and her husband, Lion Greg Holmes.

Dues Increase: On the ballot at the State Convention will be a dues increase of \$5.00. Within this Pride Report is a letter from our Finance and Planning member PDG Dave Luttrell. At the November Council of Governor's meeting a major discussion was held about the dues increase after a 5-year budget projection in August showed funding falling into the red in five years. Since then, inflation has taken off and shortened the projection in four or less years. The COG was reminded that state and district dues have not been raised since 2009. So, F&P presented a proposal to raise those dues by \$5.00 a year effective in 2023-24, if approved at the state convention. There was much discussion about this increase coming at the same time as the \$7.00 International dues change over three years. Even after all those increases, if approved, it comes to about a \$1.00 a month increase. The proposal was approved by the governors to put the dues increase on the ballot at the state convention in May for a registered delegate vote.

Zone Meetings – I look forward to seeing you at the next round of zone meetings.

In May 2023, the delegates to the State Convention will vote on a proposed \$5.00 dues increase. This will be the first dues increase since July 2010.

The two administrative funds [State Council and Office Operations] are estimated to go to \$0.00 in the 2025-2027 timeframe as they are losing about \$25,000 total each year.

Since July 2010 the Ohio Lions have lost over 4000 members or approximately \$48,000 a year in lost revenue. Clearly, if we had these members there would be no need for a dues increase at this time.

With the \$7.00 LCI dues increase approved last June, this additional \$5.00 for MD13 dues totals \$12.00 a year. This is \$1.00 a month. Whild no dues increase is desirable, an additional \$1.00 a month is not a significant burden.

The Council of Governors with the assistance of the Finance and Planning Committee has adjusted the dues allocation multiple times to delay a dues increase as long as possible. Over \$10 of the total \$12.16 annual dues is going to State Council and Office Operations. Additional adjustments will not avoid a dues increase. Costs have been reduced as much as practical without eliminating additional services. This proposed \$5.00 dues increase is the best choice for the future of Lionism in Ohio.

All delegates are urged to vote for this dues increase.

Be My Eyes Lions Fulfilling Their Role as Knights of the Blind

Every day, sighted volunteers lend their eyes to solve tasks, big and small, to help blind and low-vision people lead more independent lives.

Blind or low-vision person requests assistance:

As a blind person, whenever you need visual assistance, the volunteers are happy to help. Through the live video call, the blind individual and a volunteer can communicate directly and solve a problem.



Sighted volunteer receives video call:

As a sighted volunteer you can help just by installing the Be My Eyes app. A blind user may need help with anything from checking expiration dates, to distinguishing colors, reading instructions, or navigating new surroundings.

It costs nothing to participate. The only technology you need is a smart phone. If you know how to use your phone, you can provide a valuable service to a blind user on the other end of that phone call.


You can help OLERF find treatments and cures by continuing your commitment to our foundation. All funds received by OLERF remain in Ohio for research.

Two Buckeye trees added to Prospect Park

Prospect Community Park now has two new Buckeye trees, thanks to gifts from the Prospect Lions Club and Marion Flywheels Car Club.

The two organizations donated the Autumn Splendor Buckeye trees in appreciation of the free use of the park for the Classic Car Show on Labor Day weekend. This was the second year of the show, featuring classic cars, some dating back a century.

Rick VanGundy of Inspirations Landscaping in Warrensburg, Ohio and his crew planted the trees this fall near the park's playground.

They were assisted by Lions Club member Ben O'Dell who is also a member of the Prospect Park Commission. He thanked the Park's maintenance personnel for their intensive work before and after the trees were planted.

O'Dell and Lion Rick Carey, who is also a member of the Flywheels Club, had discussed the gift of the trees as a demonstration of thanks for the free use of the park.

O'Dell said, "The Buckeye tree is the state tree of Ohio, so it's a perfect legacy to give to our community park. Autumn Splendor is a beautiful tree with red foliage in the fall and will be an attractive addition to the park."

VanGundy added, "This hybrid is about 10 feet tall and will grow to about 35 feet high with nice fall color."

The Classic Car Show has been a success with more than 200 cars, trucks, motorcycles and other classics on display. Admission for visitors was free.

Prospect Lions and Flywheel Club split the proceeds of the event, which comes from registration fees paid by drivers of the classic cars. Prospect Lions use the income to provide scholarships to local students.

Lions Club members have voted to place two plaques indicating identity of the species and the donation by the two organizations.




