Being a Blessing.....

I'm sure you've all heard Past Council Chair Dave Risen say the word mitzvah; a Jewish term for "doing a good deed". PCC Dave also told us in the fall that our district donated enough money to be eligible for a \$13,000 Community Action Grant. So, after asking for suggestions on how to use the funds, it has been decided that we do Blessing Boxes (see pictures below). It's a smaller version of a food pantry and is the responsibility of a group that wants to help those that are food deprived.

The Blessing Box in the picture is situated by the Parks & Recreation/Senior Center in Hilliard and is maintained by a local church. A great location that serves youth, families and senior citizens alike. I'm looking for clubs or a zone that will make a commitment to utilize a Blessing Box to serve your community on an ongoing basis.

The district will apply for the grant, pay for the box kit, lumber, hardware, a plaque and give \$100 towards food for the box. The club/zone will be responsible for putting the box together and keeping it stocked. Think of the fun you will have building the box together and the satisfaction of knowing that you are helping your community in a new way.



We have enough funds through the grant to purchase at least 10 kits and supplies, I just need to know if you want to be a part of this new opportunity. I need to apply for the grant soon, so please contact me at <u>ohiolions@gmail.com</u> by May 15th if you want a box or two. And thank you in advance for being a blessing to others.

On another note, the State Convention is just weeks away and if you are planning to be a delegate from your club, remember that you need to be registered for the convention. 

CERTIFICATION OF DELEGATES TO THE MD13 STATE CONVENTION Articles XI Section 5 of the MD13 – Ohio Lions, Inc. Constitution states the following:

Each chartered Club in good standing on the first day of any convention of Multiple District 13- Ohio Lions, Inc. shall be entitled to one (1) Delegate and one (1) Alternate for every ten (10) of its members who have been enrolled for at least one year and a day in the club, or a major fraction thereof, five (5) being considered a major fraction. Membership shall be shown by records of the International Association Office as of the first day of the month last proceeding the month during which the convention is held. Any club which is newly chartered, and any other chartered club which takes in new members prior to the convening of any such convention, shall have its delegate quota determined on the basis of members who have been enrolled in the club for at least one year and a day as shown on such record date in the records of the international office. In all cases each club in good standing shall be entitled to at least one (1) delegate and one (1) alternate. Selection of each Delegate or Alternate shall be evidenced by certificate signed by the President or Secretary of each Club.

Additionally, Article XI Section 7 of the MD13 – Ohio Lions, Inc. Constitution states:

All Past District Governors who on the date of any Convention of the Organization are members in good standing of any Club belonging to Multiple District 13 – Ohio Lions, Inc., shall be considered a Delegate-At-Large, irrespective, and exclusive of any Delegate quota of their club. Nothing herein shall be construed to allow any person more than one (1) vote upon occasion or in connection with any question before the Convention of Multiple District 13 – Ohio Lions, Inc.

Accordingly, we the undersigned officers of the above named Lions Club do hereby certify the above Club Membership information is accurate and the Lions listed below are the officially recognized Delegates, Delegates-At-Large and Alternates chosen to represent our club at the MD13 – Ohio Lions 2023 State Convention, in all relevant matters.

MD-13 Constitution Existing language:

Section 3 State Revenue and Funds

The revenue received under Section 1 and 2 of Article VIII shall be distributed as state funds and as district funds [Refer to Article X Section 1.]. The state funds shall total **\$12.16** of the annual per capita dues. The allocation of state revenue among funds will be determined by the Council of Governors upon recommendation of the Finance and Long-Range Planning Committee and will be documented in the MD13 Policy Manual.

Proposed Language, change in RED

Section 3 State Revenue and Funds

The revenue received under Section 1 and 2 of Article VIII shall be distributed as state funds and as district funds [Refer to Article X Section 1.]. The state funds shall total \$17.16 of the annual per capita dues. The allocation of state revenue among funds will be determined by the Council of Governors upon recommendation of the Finance and Long-Range Planning Committee and will be documented in the MD13 Policy Manual.

Rationale:

Since there has been a decline in membership since the last dues increase over 12 years ago, the Ohio Lions membership has dropped over 4000 Lions. This loss of revenue has impacted the two operational funds of MD13 (State Council and Office Operations). These funds are losing approximately \$25,000 each year and are estimated to run out of money around 2025-2027. For this reason, a dues increase is proposed.

Cutting costs has been performed during this timeframe. However, there is a limit to this; after that Lion services must be impacted. An organization that is actively cutting services such as training and recruiting Lion leaders cannot thrive. A thriving growing Ohio Lions is in everyone's best interest.

If the Ohio Lions had not lost these members (i.e. over \$40,000 in in one year alone), this proposal would not be necessary, We have been unable to stem our losses in membership. To survive and then hopefully grow, the Ohio Lions need to approve this proposal.

STEP ONE

STEP THREE

Remove all labels; personal information must at least be blacked out

STEP TWO

Clean each bottle, please.

STEP FOUR

Get the bottles to a drop off point: state convention or district location. Ask your District GST for drop off information.
