SERVICE – Goal #2

Not exactly, you should be proud of what your club is accomplishing, you should be shouting from the rooftops and congratulating each other on your commitment to serving others. You should also be checking out other club's service projects via MyLion. Imagine the number of new project ideas you might get.

There is also another reason to report your service hours...Lions Clubs International works with other for-profit organizations throughout the year to get monetary support. That's where our service grants come from, the more support the number and amount of grants go up. How does LCI use your service hour numbers? When they go out and talk to those organizations, they tell them, we served 3 million people last year. That organization will respond, prove it. By taking the data that you supply via MyLion, they can compile the number of people served and types of projects to show that we did serve that many people.

So reporting your projects helps your club and your district get needed funds to help even more people in OH5.

If you ever need help in using MyLion, please do not hesitate to reach out for assistance. Our District Administrator, 1VG Mike Kerek is there to help, along with GST Chair Jane Jarrow and 2VG Ben Dawson.
