Congratulations to all those clubs in OH5 who participated in the Fall Into Service week (October 9-16) as well as those who continue to serve their communities regardless of the timing! There were some wonderful examples of projects, great and small, that marked the occasion.

For example, the Reynoldsburg Lions partnered with the Reynoldsburg Impact Church and the local VFW, along with representatives from each of their branch clubs: Giant Killer Nation, Village of Hope, and Whitehall Area, to provide 6 games, prizes, and the cooking and serving of 1000 hot dogs + chips, to 1200 + kids and their families at the Reynoldsburg Community Halloween Party. 36 volunteers, 1200 people served, 124 hours. Wow!

Meanwhile, Lions from the new Eastside Lions Club, Sunbury Lions Club, and the Tri-Village Lions Club spent several hours at the Ohio State School for the Blind, clearing/prepping/planting/mulching the Sensory Garden so that it will be ready to be bloom next spring, to be enjoyed by the students at the school. 16 volunteers, LOTS of folks who will enjoy, 48 hours.

As of this writing more than half the clubs in OH5 have reported service projects through MyLion, and we know there are several more who have performed service but haven't logged it into the system as yet. Our goal is to have ALL the clubs in our District join with clubs from across Ohio to report service again this year. Remember, MD13 was the only multiple district WORLDWIDE to have accomplished that goal last year. Let's make it two in a row! (Of note – none of the LEO clubs have reported service in the system to date. If your club sponsors a LEO club, please encourage them – or help them! – to enter their service alongside your own.)

As we move toward the Holiday season, there will be plenty of opportunities to serve. Let's keep up the good work. That's what Lions do best – WE SERVE!

The Grove City Lions Club recently purchased an ORCam My Eye for the use of a local resident with extremely low vision. If you have not heard of the OrCam, it can be a life altering device for a person of low vision as this is a camera with artificial intelligence built in that has the ability to gather visual information and be communicated to the person all in real time.

Among other things this device will read printed materials such as menus, magazines and books and can read currency and differentiate between a 1 and 5 dollar bill. It also has “face recognition” which will “say” a person’s name.

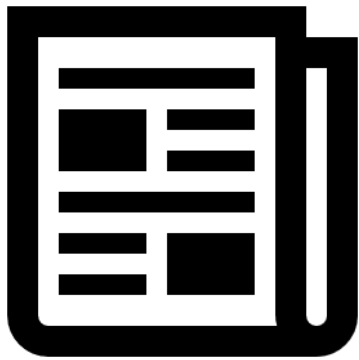
After a few months of research the Grove City Lions was able to make contact with the OrCam sales rep and within three days had the OrCam purchased.

We feel this is worthy device that gives the wearer some independence and also the care giver more independence. As stated in the OrCam manual, this is not a device for mobility and should not replace use of a cane or guide dog.

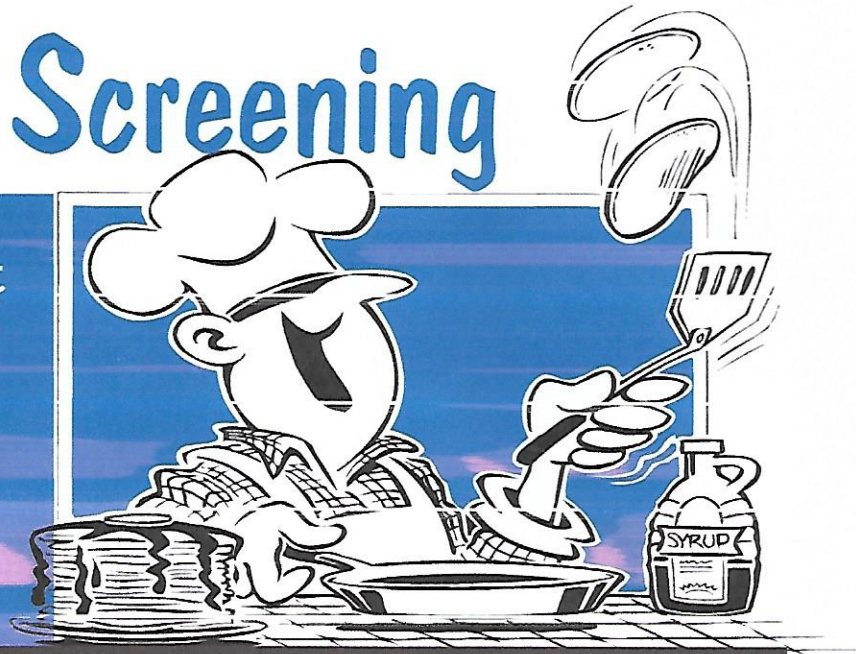

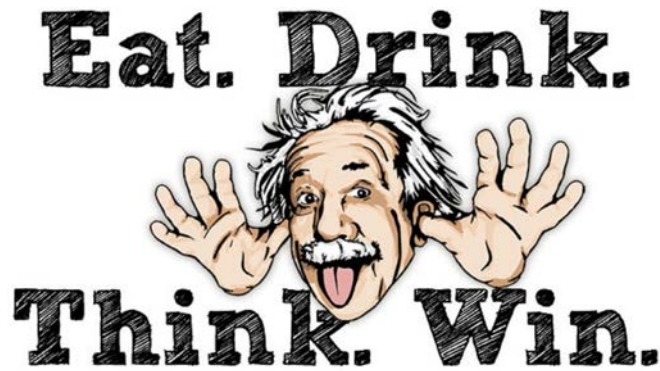
