OHIO LEO STATE CONVENTION

Attached to this newsletter is the registration form for the Ohio Leo State Convention on Saturday, February 24, 2024, in Waldo, Ohio (between Marion & Delaware, Ohio). We encourage you to attend.

This is a wonderful 1 day event to bring Leos and advisors together to learn about what each club does and how you serve. There will also be leadership training and a service project. We have heard that in the past, Leos have said that the state convention was one of their favorite activities. There are some items we need your help with regarding this event - even if no one from your club attends:

- Will your club be attending the Convention? Yes or no. (Need that info by January 9th.)
- If attending, while registration is needed by February 9, 2024, we need to know shirt sizes for attendees by January 12, 2024. Please Email that information to youth@ohiolions.org.
- If attending, we are asking each club to prepare a tri-fold "storyboard" that shares information about your club, pictures, etc. to tell who you are and in what ways you serve your community and beyond.
- If attending, there will also be time to share your "Best Project" with attendees. Think about one project that is your favorite and prepare a presentation.
- The Waldo Food Pantry will be our service project at the convention. They have shared that the items most needed are toilet paper, paper towels, Kleenex, all-purpose cleaners, and glass cleaners. We are encouraging clubs to bring these items to the convention.
 - If you are not attending, would your club like to participate in this project or provide similar items to a pantry in your area?






