IPDG Debbie Luttrell and her all-star team, Paul & Kelly Hogrell and Jen Luttrell, put together a service project that will be remembered for a long time. 500 busy-bags for children in Nationwide and Dayton Childrens Hospitals, completed in less than an hour. We won't forget the invaluable assistance of Sgt At Arms Stu Koble, who generously provided his truck and trailer to transport the items to and from Deer Creek, nor the strong backs and great attitudes of Lions Lisa Stackel, who unloaded much of the trailer on the inbound side, and the Cols East Side Lions, who loaded up 72 boxes of the bags at the end. The Martin family gave a presentation that saved lunch, in my opinion, and then stuck around to help with the busy-bags...including the kids, Logan and Cora, who worked just as hard as the adults! 2VDG Carl Gass and Lion Bill Bretthauer made pulled pork for the hospitality room that was gone so fast, I almost missed out completely! CS Gary Holloway gave excellent presentations on GMA and Club Resources. I absolutely loved Lion Nikki Friermood's rendition of TAPS at the necrology – capped off the ceremony perfectly - and Lion Pastor Jeremy Harper was spot-on in his message. I also really enjoyed 2VDGE Gary Likens opening lunch with the National Anthem! PDG Jackie Miller and her team did an amazing job pulling together the convention, and outside of the things that were beyond our control, (i.e. lunch, PA,) it was a success. The planning was worth the time.

I do want to interject something here – Jackie, Toni, Carl and I met with the Deer Creek GM and a couple of key people this past week to address our concerns. Tri-Village Lions share service success!

The Tri-Village Lions were proud to head up the Tri-Village Packers – a coalition of community groups that included everyone from the Cities of Upper Arlington and Grandview Heights, to the Northwest Kiwanis Club, the Tri-Village and Upper Arlington Rotary Clubs, and an amazing group of community volunteers to mount our second major food distribution within the Tri-Village schools.

Folks are surprised to hear that within the seemingly well-situated communities of Upper Arlington, Grandview, and Marble Cliff, there are still hungry children and families who deal with food insufficiency on an ongoing basis. Last Fall, we sent home food for 93 children over the five-day Thanksgiving Break who would be missing the availability of free school lunches during school vacation. On the heels of that successful first-effort, the Tri-Village Packers expanded our efforts to provide nine days of food for 107 children from the Tri-Village area to support them during their Spring Break.

We look forward to sharing how the project came together with our Lions colleagues at the upcoming Learn to Roar.



Spring Break Food Distribution BY THE NUMBERS...

Between March 12th and March 22nd:

160+ community volunteers gave more than **300 service** hours

Moved, unboxed, sorted 1000+ lbs of food
Packed more than 4000 food items in 107 bags

31 children had special dietary needs/restrictions that required individual packing

\$1675 in grocery cards distributed to buy fresh produce and dairy

Assembled **62 craft kits** for children from 4-12 **78 High Five/Highlights magazines** included for children from 2-12.

FROM CC DAVE STOCKUM

Spring has sprung, and the "sprung" has had one unpleasant surprise. The March 14 EF3 tornado in Logan County of OH1 was terribly destructive. In the wake of this disaster, local residents and businesses responded swiftly and started relief efforts almost as soon as the tornado departed. The Logan County United Way has provided the infrastructure for the coordination of these efforts. As a result, OH1 leaders (DG Deb Crawford and Cabinet) have partnered with the LCUW. OH1 has collected, either directly or by commitments, over \$31,000 at this writing. As the LCUW informs OH1 of needs, these funds will be used to supply those needs. Due to the severity of the tornado, filling these needs will be a long term project. If you or your club wish to donate to this relief and recovery effort, you may make a direct contribution to Lions District OH1. Make sure to add tornado relief on the memo line. Send the check to CT/PDG John Davis, 933 Thornapple Lane, Findlay, Ohio 45840. If you wish to make a tax-deductible donation, go to the Logan County United Way website, www.uwlogan.org, and find the "donation" tab. The site automatically creates a digital receipt when a donation is finalized. If you want to have your donation recognized as a Lions offering, after your name use a dash and give a Lions designation. For example, Jane Doe – OH1 Lions or John Doe - Western Hills Lions would go on the name line. Make sure your name matches the way it is listed on the credit card you are using to make the donation.

Let me offer two thoughts as we move through the District Convention Season. First, **don't wait to elect your officers**. My challenge is to submit those names to the International by May 15. Second, don't wait to see who plans to remain in your club. Seek out club members who have been absent or inactive and find out how you can keep them involved. We are doing an excellent job of adding new members (722 to date), but we need to work on keeping these new Lions and reinvigorating the longtime members of our clubs. Let all our members know how important they are to our mission – new voices and old voices alike! Attention to Retention is essential. Orientation and training play a key role in retention. So does active Service. We Serve. Best wishes in the coming months; enjoy family and friends during the solar eclipse gatherings, spring break, and Spring blossoming.


