FROM DG MIKE KEREK

THIS IS THE YEAR WE WANT ALL CLUBS TO SHINE!



We have a new program, the Club Engagement Initiative. Any club that gets at least one new member this year, has at least one new officer this year and gets at least one officer trained, (via any of the district trainings, through a Guiding Lion, or through personal training from either the DG, GLT, or ZC,) does at least one new service project and gives one new donation, and has at least one new officer for next year, will qualify for special recognition. We, as a district, have pledged to help clubs attain these goals if asked. We also want clubs to strive for the LCI Club Excellence Award – if you think your club will qualify, let your zone chair or me know so we can help with the process of applying!

We are starting a new District Calendar, which will be available every month in the Pride Report and will also be available in other venues that we are working out. We want our members and our clubs to be informed of upcoming events that pertain to the district.

YOU, as individual clubs and individual Lions, must embrace change before it can happen. Lions is, at the root, club based. You have to plan and execute the service projects and fundraisers, recruit and orient new members, file the taxes and maintain the compliance. It is up to you to make your club relevant in today's society, today's culture, and that may mean changes in how you operate.

But the district level has a responsibility as well, to be a resource you can count on in a myriad of ways, and that is a goal we have set for ourselves. Help with promotion? We have our district newsletter and Facebook group, which you can post to. Help with the computer reporting? Contact me anytime. Have an event you want us to attend and participate in, maybe lend a helping hand? As long as you let us know and we don't already have something lined up with another club, we're there. Ideas for new projects? Help with membership inductions? Need assistance figuring out who to contact to help a person in need? Yes, yes and yes, we have the ability to do all these and more. FROM CC DAVE STOCKUM

A good question is "What does the Council Chairperson do?" Basically, there are two main responsibilities that go with the position. One, the CC enables the Council of Governors to effectively run the Multiple District during their year in office. Creating an agenda, along with the MDS, for the Council of Governors' Meetings and chairing the Meetings enables the CoG to oversee and help enact legislation that is needed to keep MD13 serving Ohio Lions effectively. The CC also acts as a resource person for the CoG, as well as for all Lions in the multiple district. A second responsibility of the CC is to serve as the chairperson of the GAT, the Global Action Team.

The GAT is made up of the Global Service Team, the Global Leadership Team, and the Global Membership Team. In addition to MD13 officers, these teams have officers in the State's seven sub-districts. These groups have a MD13 Chairperson elected annually by the incoming District Governors who promotes their respective aspects of MD13 Lionism. The CC mainly supports and to some degree directs these Lion leaders. Lions Clubs International is suggesting a New Voices Chairperson as a new addition to the GAT. Although it is not required yet, MD13 is in the vanguard of multiples and districts promoting this addition. Educating Ohio Lions about New Voices will be a major emphasis this year, and Lion Tamarra Parker-Stephens has accepted leadership for this task.

As Council Chairperson this year, it is my goal to fulfill these responsibilities to the best of my ability, and as a subsidiary function, keep the membership of MD13 informed of service, governance, and growth in all respects of Lionism. Newsletters are one way to stay informed. If you aren't on the MD13 Newsletter Mailing List, go to ohiolions.org and follow the links to get enrolled. Using "eNews Service" in the search box, you will find a page on which #3 directs you to the way to get enrolled for direct mailing of the MD13 Newsletter. I am looking forward to serving our multiple district as the year progresses. International President Dr. Patti Hill's theme is Changing the World. I believe small change(s) can make a big difference!

Ohio Lions Pediatric Cancer Foundation (OLPCF)

Since 2019, when the foundation began, OLPCF has awarded grants to research hospitals that are involved in pediatric cancer research. This year, their \$25,000 grant was awarded to Nationwide Childrens Hospital in Columbus. The research project, headed by Dr. Benjamin Sunkel, is working to: "uncover specific mechanisms and new avenues by which SWI/SNF mutations lead to cancerous cell phenotypes in diverse tissue settings, allowing for more precise tumor classification, accurate disease prognosis, and identification of treatment opportunities".

Obviously, I have selected one sentence from a very technical write-up regarding the research that is being done, but if they are successful in being able to identify the type of cancer, children can be treated earlier and with a better chance of survival.

You might ask where the Ohio Lions Pediatric Cancer Foundation gets its support. Easy, from the clubs and individual Lions within our district and throughout the state of Ohio. Your support is a lasting legacy in helping children diagnosed with this horrible disease.

Last month we introduced the idea of a "trading post" for the Lions of OH5. Our trading post doesn't really require a trade – we'll provide something for nothing!!! Chances are that you have leftovers from service projects, or decorations from parties or fundraisers, or procedural guides for projects that could be carried out by others – all stored in



"somebody's garage" or scattered through basements in your member's homes. Here's a chance to pass those extras on to other clubs who can put 'em to work – and get them out of YOUR garage!!!

We invite you to offer up all your leftovers for use by other clubs in OH5. We will leave you to figure out how to get the items from/to each club. This space will merely offer up the possibility.



Last month, the Tri-Village Lions offered up 8 large (make that LARGE!) sandwich board signs that we offered to give to other clubs. The Worthington Lions, the Gahanna Lions, and the New Albany Lions have all taken us up on the offer and claimed two signs each. Except... in the meantime, we found four MORE of these sandwich boards in someone else's garage. So we still have six sandwich boards available, if you want 'em!!! The sandwich boards stand 4' high, and the sign board section is 36"x24". They are made of plywood, so they are heavy – which means they are also very sturdy. We used to set them out on the curb areas as folks were approaching an intersection at which we were collecting for White Cane Day. The pictures here show the front and back of the signs (back is blank) and you are free to cover over or repaint with anything you want. This month, we thought we'd offer up something else. Last year we made first aid kits (hard-sided glasses cases stocked with bandaids, antacid, aspirin, alcohol wipes, etc.) for the local homeless shelter. We have pieces miscellaneous from those kits available (a couple hundred bandaids, a couple dozen packets of aspirin, etc.). If anyone else is planning to carry on a similar project any time soon, we'll be happy to turn over the supplies we are holding, and you can add to create all the kits you choose to compile.

August Feature Club: Troy Lions

The Troy Lions Club is in its 81st year of service. They have included Tipp City and Piqua in their service area, after those two clubs have folded. Vision assistance remains their primary focus. However recently they have become more involved in the areas of food insecurity and pediatric cancer.

The members have made a determined effort to be less of a check-writing club and more of a visible hands-on service club. They hold tea parties at local nursing homes, pre-school vision screenings, community paint nights, information booths, and participate at Wreaths Across America. They developed a fun bean-bag toss game while wearing vision-condition-simulating glasses that is used at multiple events.

Troy Lions also sponsor the Newton Leo Club. Leos assist the Lions with their Strawberry Festival booth and the Lions assist with the Leo's Pancake breakfast. Troy Lions also partner up with the Optimist Club for their Avenue of Flags project, and with another youth group that helps the Lions sort used eyeglasses.

Troy's signature project is their hearing aid recycling program, where used hearing aids are collected and, with the help of a local audiologist, re-programed and provided to needy individuals for free.
