FROM DG MIKE KEREK

I was asked at a recent meeting what the status of OH5 was. I replied, we have momentum.

- Our membership is at minus 5 as I write this, but I've heard from several clubs that they are bringing in new members soon, and we will be starting the Marion Ohio Lions Club within the next couple of months with at least 21 new members.
- We had a great Learn to Roar this past June, supplemented with Pizza Party Trainings on the west and north regions of the district to accommodate those members. We also had a great zone chair training, and the proof is out there – our zone chairs are doing a great job. Training and leadership development is going well.
- Our LCIF donations are up from last year, augmented by a substantial donation from the Memorial Fund and from various clubs, PDG Association and the District Cabinet. Almost all the money has been earmarked for disaster relief.
- While reporting could be going better, I am seeing more activities going into MyLion. Of all the areas in our district this is perhaps the weakest, but we are working on it.
- Most important, as I have visited the various zone meetings, I am hearing clubs focusing on what they CAN do as opposed to fretting about what they can't. There is where the strongest hope for our association lies.

Every club and member will deal with difficulties, whether it is having to find a new place to meet, start a new fundraiser because a long-time one no longer is viable, loss of a key member or two, or any number of other calamities that can strike with no warning. With rare exception, I'm not getting a sense of giving up in those situations. I'm seeing a circling of the wagons.

But please keep in mind you do not have to do it all alone! That's what the district cabinet is there for. Open the directory – it's full of resources, be it agencies, foundations, or committees that can help your clubs achieve more. Use them, that's why they exist.

We have momentum. With that comes success. Keep up the great work that you are all doing! Every little thing adds up to big effects. Continue to be someone's hero.

JOIN LIONS IN OH5 IN FIGHTING HUNGER LET'S MAKE A DIFFERENCE!

Dear OH5 Lions,

I'd like to share an exciting and impactful initiative with you - our commitment to growing the concept of Service-oriented Clubs focused on addressing the pressing issue of hunger in our communities. I'm reaching out to invite you to join me in this meaningful cause, and I'm seeking your assistance and collaboration.

Our primary objective is to increase our club's membership by emphasizing the power of service. To achieve this, we plan to concentrate on a specific multi-club service cause, which is hunger. We have some key questions:

- 1- Can we attract new Lions by making hunger our central focus?
- 2- Can we inspire our current Lions to dedicate their efforts to combat hunger as a cause?
- 3- If you share our passion for this idea and want to get involved, please reach out to me at pdgdave@luttrellzoo.com or call 614-459-0821.

Our goal is to recruit approximately 50 new Lions, and we have a clear plan in place:

- 1- Recruitment: We aim to bring in new members who are passionate about the cause of hunger. This can be new members in existing clubs, or new members in Service-oriented clubs.
- 2- Fundraising: We'll raise funds specifically for hunger-related initiatives.
- 3- Community Engagement: We'll identify and collaborate with organizations that require assistance.
- 4- Grant Application: We'll apply for an LCIF Hunger grant, but we'll need multiple Lions Clubs to participate and contribute 25% upfront funding for the application. For example, if we raise \$5,000, we can request a \$20,000 grant from LCIF. The more Lions clubs and communities involved, the better our chances of success.

The grant money will be used to support vital infrastructure for food banks, backpack kids programs, and other hunger-related projects. However, it cannot be used solely for purchasing food; it must contribute to sustaining the core mission in the long term.

Are you, Lions of OH5, ready to embark on a district-wide project that will make a difference in multiple communities? Are you willing to commit to recruiting new members, raising funds, collaborating with food banks, churches, and service providers, and applying for and implementing an LCIF grant?

Remember, this is a team effort, and it requires the collective dedication of many Lions. Please let me know if you or your club are interested in exploring the next steps. I plan to provide updates on our progress in the upcoming Pride Report.

Let's make this a remarkable district project, but only with the unity and enthusiasm of numerous Lions working together. **Are you in?**

October Feature Club: Worthington Noon Lions

The Worthington Noon Lions have two great service activities to share!

- 1- The 2023 Worthington Noon Lions Club School Supply Drive was a huge success! Thanks to everyone who donated to this first community service project of the new club year. The Lions delivered much needed fourth grade class list school supplies, Lakeshore teacher gift cards and OSU draw string book bags to the three fourth grade teachers, Alyssa Srail Gaydos, Taylor Rankey, and Elaine Wilson at Slate Hill Elementary School. Principal Julie Gulley shared that fourth grade in her building is at full capacity this school year. A total of 1,854 items were donated. The gift cards will enable teachers to replenish their classroom supply needs as the school year progresses. The Lions felt this much needed project wound assist parents who continue to be faced with such a difficult financial year due to inflation and still recovering from the economic downturn of the pandemic.
- 2- The 12th Annual "Battle of Hard Road" Community Service Project took place Friday, September 15, 2023. This event addressing hunger in the community, is a joint venture between the Worthington Noon Lions Club, Worthington Kilbourne High School, the Dublin Lions Club and Dublin Scioto High School. This year the Worthington and Dublin Rotary Clubs collaborated with the both Lions Clubs to help make this an impactful project. During the week leading up to the battle, WKHS Social Studies teacher coordinator, Lauren Glaros and her counterpart coordinators, Courtney Pope and Alyssa Ritchart at Dublin schools accepted food and cash donations during school hours. Worthington Resource Pantry Executive Director, Nick Linkenhoker provided a fundraising page for online donations.

This event concluded when the the two high schools played their annual football game. The goal was to see which school could raise the most food and money for their respective community food pantries. Following half time at the game, Worthington Kilbourne High School, whose donations totaled \$2,973, was announced as the "WINNER" of the battle and received the beautiful ceramic Trophy Bowl, which gets traded back and forth between the schools on a yearly basis to the winner. Regardless of which school and community wins, their resource food pantries are the real winners. This is the second year in a row for Worthington Kilbourne High School to take possession of the Trophy Bowl.

FILING DEADLINE APROACHING!

Most Lions Clubs run on the fiscal year of July 1 to June 30th. This means that their filing deadline for the IRS, Ohio Attorney General, and Unclaimed Funds is fast approaching. Don't let October end without filing these three returns for your club. The penalty for missing the deadlines can be severe. The IRS can take away your income-tax exemption. Attorney General will fine your club \$200, and the Unclaimed Funds fine is \$100 a day!


