#### **Prevent Blindness Ohio**

The Ohio Affiliate of Prevent Blindness (PBO) enhances the visual quality of life for Ohioans. PBO partners with organizations by training staff and volunteers to provide eye health & safety education to their clients, identify potential vision problems in their clients, and provide access for their clients living at 200% poverty or worse to our voluntary system of comprehensive vision care. Prevent Blindness programs and services ensure that no Ohioan, regardless of their ability to pay, goes without sight-saving vision care.

Thanks to help from our partners PBO provides adult and preschool vision screening, trains and certifies vision screeners and delivers our EyeWatch / Eye Health Advocate Program. The goal of these programs is to decrease the incidence of preventable vision loss among high-risk populations through promotion of healthy lifestyles, early detection and treatment. Volunteer vision screeners detect vision problems early, when treatment is most effective. We help underserved children start school "Ready to Learn".

This past year, our reach was wide.

- 202,287 Ohio residents have received a vision screening by one of our 2,877 volunteer Certified Vision Screeners
- 3,532 Ohio residents received free eye exams and eyeglasses

Your club can join Prevent Blindness in the fight against vision loss in your community by:

- Sponsoring an Adult or Preschool Vision Screening in your area.
- Become Certified Adult or Preschool vision screeners.

Evidence shows that up to 50% of vision problems that can lead to vision loss **CAN BE PREVENTED** with early detection and treatment. Eyes cannot be transplanted and we need to remember that when it comes to eyes, we **only get one pair**, **no spare**!

PBO serves all 88 counties in Ohio; recently provided screening training, has equipment and certification to health care and social service providers, preschool staff, and groups in Huber community Heights, Springfield, and Middletown in April will provide training at the Columbus a Metropolitan Library Franklinton Branch. PBO has been able to help adults like Brenda Jacobsen from Franklin County. She wrote saving...

"I can see so much better. My grandchildren's faces are more defined and cuter. I can read much better (to look for a job). Thank you very much."

I'm also looking for donations of Band-Aids and the like to put inside them. I'll get you a complete list of items I will be putting in them at a later date. If you can help out with donations and/or are interested in collecting the cases, please contact me and I will pick up any of these items from you. If there are other homeless areas in our District, beside Columbus, who can use these,

please reach out to me and let me know. A great way to help out those in need in our own District!
