NEWS AND EVENTS FROM MD-13

OUR NEIGHBORS IN KENTUCKY REACH OUT FOR RELIEF

Our Kentucky relief project is an ongoing statewide project through June 30, 2022. As victims are slowly beginning to get their insurance claims dealt with, they are trickling back to the affected towns. Clubs, individual Lions, and our community partners can participate in one of three ways -

1. pack plastic totes with household items - sheets, kitchen utensils, tools, anything from the list. District service coordinators can arrange pick up points for the totes. Millersport Lions are allowing us to collect all the totes in their clubhouse, to be taken to the Kentucky Lions distribution centers. See the message below re: collection at the state convention, and the next page for information about what is needed by our neighbors in Kentucky.
2. Monetary donation to help buy 2"X4"s, 2"X6"s and plywood to help with repairs for the uninsured and the many UNDER-insured. These folks are just now able to start patching roofs and walls now that the insurance adjusters have been out. Instead of collecting wood, we are collecting money to purchase the wood closer to Hopkinsville and get it delivered to the distribution center.
3. --Money can be sent to Ohio Lions, Inc 4074 Hoover Rd., Grove City OH 43123 or there is a Paypal link for donations on ohiolions.org.
4. Sending thoughts and prayers for those struggling to make ends meet, to secure housing, to cope with the depression and PTSD that are affecting their families.

With the disastrous events unfolding in the Ukraine, the world has turned its attention there. This is not to negate efforts to help internationally. But our neighbors in Kentucky are also displaced and desperate, just without the continued media coverage. We want to show them the heart that Lions have.

LET'S SHOW THEM THAT WE CARE!

We will be collecting totes for Kentucky victims at the state convention in May. Please use your district newsletters and social media to get word out to clubs to participate. I am attaching the list of requested items, and, talking with volunteers who were just down there working the distribution centers, the need is great. They have food but no pots, pans, or microwave to cook it in. They need sheets of all sizes, towels, tools, kitchen utensils like spoons and can openers.

Some clubs can donate a small tote of items from the dollar store or tied fleece blankets. Other clubs can "adopt a family" and fill different totes with the items for different rooms of their house - kitchen, garage, bathroom, pantry and broom closet, etc. Ask your communities too. We're looking at a PR session with a bicycle shop that wants to work with us to fix up and donate 50 bikes. Who around your area would do something similar?

The attached photo is not something you have to use, just a visual that I used to pitch the project to my church for support (thus the altar backdrop). Consider putting a photo with your newsletter article or Facebook post to your Club.

Again, this Kentucky collection and the donations collected are the service project component of our LCI Promotions grant. Let's go big.

CERTIFICATION OF DELEGATES TO THE MD13 STATE CONVENTION

Articles XI Section 5 of the MD13 – Ohio Lions, Inc. Constitution states the following:

Each chartered Club in good standing on the first day of any convention of Multiple District 13- Ohio Lions, Inc. shall be entitled to one (1) Delegate and one (1) Alternate for every ten (10) of its members who have been enrolled for at least one year and a day in the club, or a major fraction thereof, five (5) being considered a major fraction. Membership shall be shown by records of the International Association Office as of the first day of the month last proceeding the month during which the convention is held. Any club which is newly chartered, and any other chartered club which takes in new members prior to the convening of any such convention, shall have its delegate quota determined on the basis of members who have been enrolled in the club for at least one year and a day as shown on such record date in the records of the international office. In all cases each club in good standing shall be entitled to at least one (1) delegate and one (1) alternate. Selection of each Delegate or Alternate shall be evidenced by certificate signed by the President or Secretary of each Club.

Additionally, Article XI Section 7 of the MD13 – Ohio Lions, Inc. Constitution states:

All Past District Governors who on the date of any Convention of the Organization are members in good standing of any Club belonging to Multiple District 13 – Ohio Lions, Inc., shall be considered a Delegate-At-Large, irrespective and exclusive of any Delegate quota of their club. Nothing herein shall be construed to allow any person more than one (1) vote upon occasion or in connection with any question before the Convention of Multiple District 13 – Ohio Lions, Inc.

Accordingly, we the undersigned officers of the above named Lions Club do hereby certify the above Club Membership information is accurate and the Lions listed below are the officially recognized Delegates, Delegates-At-Large and Alternates chosen to represent our club at the MD13 – Ohio Lions 2021 State Convention, in all relevant matters.
