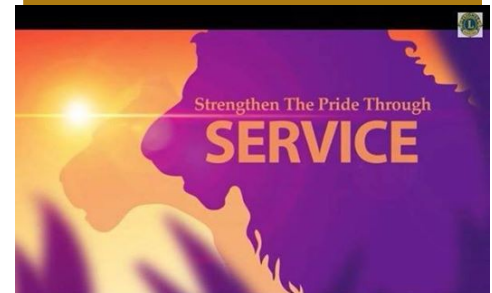

Tri-Village Lions -- Recognition and Involvement

The Tri-Village Lions are continuing the push to get involved in diabetes screening in two ways -- by screening members of our own community, and by helping other Lions Clubs in OH5 to do the same.

We have been asked to provide diabetes screening at several community events in the Tri-Village area, as well as some upcoming Lions events around the district -- for which we are pulling in help!

On February 11, 20 Lions from six different clubs in the district received training in how to screen for diabetes under the auspices of the Central Ohio Diabetes Association (CODA). Lions from Tri-Village, Canal Winchester, Columbus Northeast, New Albany, Reynoldsburg, and the Worthington Noon are now ready to start screening -- and we'll start (together) at the upcoming District convention. On the morning of March 10, a team of OH5 Lions will be screening for diabetes from 8:00 AM - 12:00 PM. Our goal is two-fold. We want to provide an important health screening for Lions in attendance, and we are hoping that those who attend will see how straightforward the procedure is, and want to see their clubs get involved, as well.

The Tri-Village Lions were fortunate enough to get some great publicity for our diabetes screening program in the Jan/Feb edition of a community publication, the *Tri-Village News* (<https://tinyurl.com/TVL-Diabetes>).

We have also gotten word that an upcoming edition of the Lion Magazine will include an article about our Easter Project last year. We are thrilled with the visibility.

Our next Pub Trivia Contest will be on March 18th (see flyer elsewhere in this newsletter). You can get a preview of the fun by joining us at the District convention on March 11th, when Tri-Village Lion Jeff Davis will be throwing out some great trivia questions to get you primed.

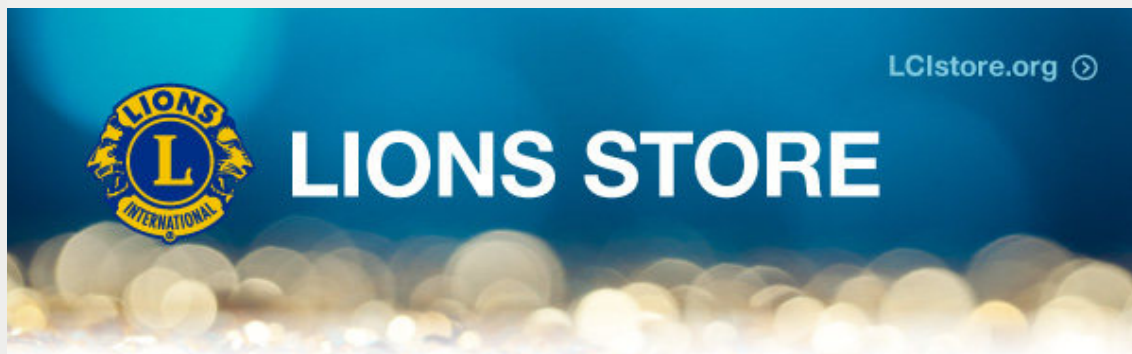

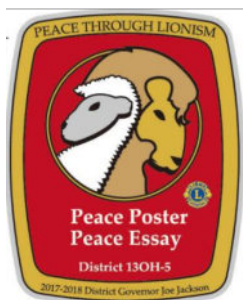

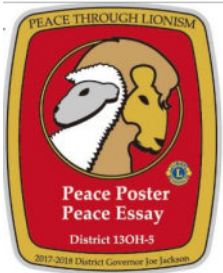
