

Mobile Eye Screening Unit (MESU)

\$50,000 Needed

11 Lions throughout MD13, attended the Regional Lions Leadership Institute Level 3 in the fall of 2016. Level 3 participants choose a project to carry out. The group the previous year, the 1st time Level 3 RLLI was held, began the Steps Program for Pediatric Cancer. Our project is to buy and equip a mobile eye screening unit.

The van will be used by Lions Clubs, Zones, and Districts throughout MD13 (Ohio). It will allow the Lions to provide screening for amblyopia, visual acuity, myopia, hyperopia, color blindness, and glaucoma.

It will be equipped with two PlusOptix Vision Screening devices, a VIP Box, a LEA Box, Ishihara Pseudoisochromatic Test, Infant/Pediatric Color Test, eye chart, a printer, and a generator, which will enable the vehicle to be utilized at multiple venues such as fairs, festivals, schools that do not have the necessary area to conduct the screenings.

The van will be a 22-25-foot vehicle and will have a wrap advertising Lions and LCIF. So, it will be a traveling billboard for Ohio Lions – a win/win situation for all!

Should our group be unfortunate enough to not get you all to purchase or donate the funds we need for our share of the Grant from LCIF, all donated money will be going to the Ohio Lions Sight & Hearing Foundation, a 501c(3) organization, to be utilized for other sight and hearing needs – another win/win situation for us all!

If every club donated \$1,000 we'd be able to meet our share of the Grant and be able to help Ohio Lions move forward in this fight against preventable blindness!
