You can continue hosting meetings via electronic methods to keep your club active and people who don't do computers are able to dial in on their phones. How about starting a phone chain to contact your members to say hello? You can also create a project phone chain to reach out to the elderly, students, etc. Why not put a stuffed Lion or animal in your window to let others know you are there and provide a little joy? There are so many things you can do as Lions while we stay at home. Take some time to "think outside of the box" then reach out to others. We have Lions shopping for those who cannot get out, taking dinners to elderly, making face masks, reading to children, etc. The possibilities are endless. You can even install a new member using electronic media (try it!).

Don't give up on being a Lion, and continue to work and recruit members in a different way. You can do it!

OH5 Lions Come ROARING Back!

(As things begin to open up around us, the Lions of OH5 are starting to <u>cautiously</u> emerge from the stay-at-home orders and explore what can be done to pick up where we left off – serving our communities and sharing that commitment with friends and fellow Lions. Here is a rundown on the opportunities every Lion in the District can be part of – and we hope you will!)

LEARN TO ROAR - June 22

We won't be face-to-face for this year's *Learn to Roar* on **June 20**, but the only thing we'll have to miss is the great midday meal from Der Dutchman restaurant. The District's day of leadership training is going to happen – remotely! All of the same sessions that were planned for June 22nd will still be offered, and every Lion in the District (not just the club officers, but EVERYONE) is welcome to participate.

Typically, the training begins at 10:00 AM, with two 50-minutes time slots, three sessions per slot, being presented before lunchtime. We break for a Der Dutchman lunch buffet, and then start in again, with two 50-minute time slots, three sessions each, before the training is complete and Lions offer feedback on the information and training they just received. That is EXACTLY what will happen this year (except you have to supply your own lunch!).

Look over the sessions to be offered (listed here) and determine which session you would like to attend during which time period. Then you can visit the District's website and download the handouts/slides for each session in advance, so that you have them in front of you as the speaker is talking. In the same place you find the handouts, you will find a phone number and a computer link for each session. If you are going to attend the session by phone, you need only dial that toll-free number at the right time for the session to be able to hear the presentation. If you are comfortable with video meetings (or you are willing to explore the possibility!), instead of just listening on your phone, you can just click on the link provided to watch the session and see the speaker.

Because no one has to travel further than their computer screen (and maybe not even *that* far if you are using your telephone) to take advantage of the training, there is no charge and there is no preregistration necessary. You just call or click in at the appropriate time and learn what Lions are doing these days to fulfill our commitment to service.

More information will be sent out in separate mailings over the next few weeks. For now, save the date and plan to join us on June 20 – and LEARN TO ROAR!

Within every club, zone, and district, we have three types of Lions.

Red Light Lions - We are sheltering in place until the virus is eradicated from the face of the earth. Each of these Lions want to stay engaged and help as they can. As a leader, we need to be mindful that they are important to our organization. We must be respectful of their thoughts.

Yellow Light Lions – We will meet and serve if safe practices are in place. Each of these Lions want to begin to adjust to a new normal and move past the self-imposed quarantine. As a leader, we must capture their excitement and enthusiasm, or risk them leaving our clubs.

Green Light Lions – We are ready to serve, meet and lead as we have always done. Each of these Lions want everything to be just like it was for the past decade. As a leader, we must also build upon their willingness to take action.



As we move into the 2020-21 year, with new club officers, how do we find a solution to blend the needs of these three groups? At the end of the day, we realize that to continue to serve, we must retain the members that we have, while finding creative ways to engage others.

CONSIDER THE FOLLOWING:

Redefine "Service" to include serving our members during this time of need.

Our **Red-Light Lions** can be charged with serving the club by checking on all members and communicating club events to members and the community.

Our **Yellow-Light Lions** can be charged with finding new ways to safely serve or to find safe way sto conitinue the traditional service projects.

Our *Green-Light Lions* can take the responsibility of interacting with the community and continuing to provide exemplary service, in accordance with guidelines published by the local governments.

Redefine meetings to include the use of a digital or remote format

While for over 100 years most Lions Clubs have met in person, at least twice a month, we must now find a way to blend the needs of these three groups of Lions. Many clubs have moved to a Zoomtype meeting, with the option to call in on the phone. In other clubs, there is a group ready to get back to a more traditional meeting. Socialization is a key benefit for our members. However, when we consider the needs of all three groups, our meetings may neet to be simulcast to those who feel safer at home. Also, our dues may need to be unbundled, if the cost of meals are included.

LCI Board of Directors Take Steps to Help Our Clubs

Here is an overview of the resolution approved by the Board of Directors:

- Flexible payments No clubs will be suspended or cancelled through December 31, 2020 for late payment of dues.
- Charter and entrance fees waiver We have waived all charter and entrance fees from July 1 – December 31, 2020.

These measures will help Lions facing financial hardships, and give our clubs hope, encouragement, and an opportunity to start the new Lion year with renewed energy and optimism.

This may be a time of great need, but we will overcome this together. For more than a century, Lions have taken on the greatest challenges facing humanity. That is who we are, and what we do.

So let us stand together. And let us remember just how important we are to our communities and the world.

With support from the community during the 2019 Holiday season, the Tri-Village Lions turned a new fundraising project into a service project. In addition to buying pies from Der Dutchman Restaurant for their own holiday enjoyment, buyers had the opportunity to purchase pies to be donated to homeless shelters and soup kitchens throughout Central Ohio. More than 150 pies were donated to feed the hungry.

We have had to forego so many traditions over the last few months. Perhaps it is time for a familiar 4th of July celebration. There may be no parade this year, but what is more American than apple pie (or cherry, or blueberry!!!). We invite Lions Clubs throughout OH5 and MD-13 to join us in helping to address LCI's hunger initiative by donating pies through the Tri-Village Lions' upcoming sale. The cost for pies is \$15/each. Individuals or Lions Clubs can donate 5 pies at the cost of \$75, or 10 pies for \$150. All proceeds from this activity are used to support the many service and philanthropic activities for which the Lions are known.

The donated pies will be a combination of three All-American favorites from the Der Dutchman menu – Cherry, Apple, and Blueberry (red, white, and blue!). You can designate which shelter/soup kitchen in Central Ohio should receive your donation, or you can make arrangements to have someone pick up your pies on the delivery date and share them with a facility in your home community.
