Closing Out a Successful Year

A Report from District Governor Joe Jackson

My thanks to both Cabinet and Club members who made this year successful. In addition, both Zone Chairs and members of the Convention Committee made events run smoothly.

What can all Lions do to increase service to their communities?

- Ask people you know to help out: some people love to sell things and others can help out in other ways.
- Be visible: are there eye glass collection boxes in community areas such as public libraries?
- Do club members have a Lions License plate on their car(s)? Profits from license plate sales help fund the Ohio Lions Foundation, which funds disaster relief efforts and adaptive equipment for disabled individuals.
- Remember that many LEO members become Lions; however, many counties such as Darke, Morrow, and Madison, have no LEO clubs.
- Plan to buy a Peace/Essay Poster Kit for any students ages 11-13; if your school isn't interested, ask your Superintendent for a list of homeschooled students as they are eligible to participate. Private school students may also be interested to participate.
- Although some clubs close for the summer, ask interested members to collect eye glass cases for first aid kits and items for veterans such as clothing, hygiene items that can be distributed at later time.
- Our district has many agencies that help community members: both our EyeBanks, Central Ohio and West Central, continue to need club donations. In addition, please consider a agency such as VOICECORPS that provides a reading service to Ohio citizens.
- We also need more than one Campus Club. Our District has many postsecondary programs that could support a Campus Club. Interested? Call me and I will help to organize a program.
- Finally, remember the importance of donations to LCIF: \$100 could fund 2 cataract surgeries, clean water for 14 people, or 100 measles vaccinations.
- All Ohio districts now support on ongoing effort to support research to cure pediatric cancer. Plan on being at Summit High School in Reynoldsburg, on November 5 to participate in the Super Braxton Event.

OUR NEIGHBORS IN KENTUCKY REACH OUT FOR RELIEF

Our Kentucky relief project is an ongoing statewide project through June 30, 2022. As victims are slowly beginning to get their insurance claims dealt with, they are trickling back to the affected towns. Clubs, individual Lions, and our community partners can participate in one of three ways -

1. pack plastic totes with household items - sheets, kitchen utensils, tools, anything from the list. District service coordinators can arrange pick up points for the totes. Millersport Lions are allowing us to collect all the totes in their clubhouse, to be taken to the Kentucky Lions distribution centers. See the message below re: collection at the state convention, and the next page for information about what is needed by our neighbors in Kentucky.
2. Monetary donation to help buy 2"X4"s, 2"X6"s and plywood to help with repairs for the uninsured and the many UNDER-insured. These folks are just now able to start patching roofs and walls now that the insurance adjusters have been out. Instead of collecting wood, we are collecting money to purchase the wood closer to Hopkinsville and get it delivered to the distribution center.
3. --Money can be sent to Ohio Lions, Inc 4074 Hoover Rd., Grove City OH 43123 or there is a Paypal link for donations on ohiolions.org.
4. Sending thoughts and prayers for those struggling to make ends meet, to secure housing, to cope with the depression and PTSD that are affecting their families.

With the disastrous events unfolding in the Ukraine, the world has turned its attention there. This is not to negate efforts to help internationally. But our neighbors in Kentucky are also displaced and desperate, just without the continued media coverage. We want to show them the heart that Lions have.

Sue Thomas – FBEye

On **July 14th**, the Tri-Village Lions will welcome Sue Thomas to Central Ohio to meet with Lions and community members and talk about her experiences. Sue, a native of Ohio, lost her hearing as a child but never let it hold her back. She was a junior figure skating champion, and upon graduation from college became an undercover agent for the FBI, using her skill in lipreading to help in their investigations. Her time there was chronicled in a cable TV series several year ago called “Sue Thomas: FBEye.”

In Sue’s own words, “The Lions changed my life when they supported me in getting my first hearing ear dog. I am coming to share with the members my sincere thanks for this grateful gift that has forever changed my life. Some 38 years have passed and I am on my fourth service dog That provides me with my help for my deafness and my multiple sclerosis. A number of years ago I had the privilege of standing before the Lions USA Canada Forum in Omaha, and I do hope someday that I might be able to return to this body to let them know how sincerely grateful I am.

I will be coming to talk about my deafness and my service dogs and the TV series, *Sue Thomas: FBEye* and to answer any questions that you might have for me.”

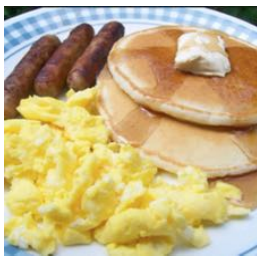

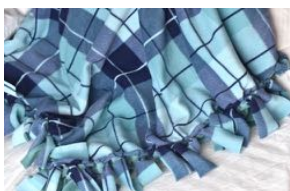
