Nutting-Founded in 1939 because these men could not find Leader Dogs from any other source, the school has grown into one of the largest and most respected institutions of its kind in the world. The three founders, who each served as President of the Leader Dog optimization, worlder with their Lions in the Detroit, Michigan and to locate a facility to house their dream. With great vision the yealer da farmboare and a few acres on the south side of Rochester, Michigan. Through the years over 14,000 Leader Dog teams have been trained. Last year nearly 29 teams guadated, reading a world of new possibilities and Independence for the blind grodusts. For over 70 years Lons Olds around the globe have invested millions of follates in support of the Leader Dogs for the Blind School, making it the Leagest project of their organization. Any blind person who wants to increase his/ther mobility and freedom can apply to attend the Leader Dogs should and be anaerded a Leader Dog. Any Lion may request an application for the school and be lander of a blind individual. Through the generosity of Lions and others, there is no cost (other than incidentals) for the blind person to attend the school and obtain a Leader Dog.

MD CONVENTION REPORT

What a great MD Convention we had in Surrey, BC. It was a privilege to give the State of the District Address and to talk about all the accomplishments that happened in our District last year thanks to the dedication of all of our wonderful Lions. I thank-you for being and "Creating Health Lions". Our District had several wonderful achievement awards as well: **We have AMAZING Lions in our District.**

Congratulations to **PZC Leonard Parenteau, who received a Zone Chair Excellence Award** for the 4th Year. He goes out of his way to serve the clubs in his Zone.

Lioness of the Year: Priest River Lioness President, Linda Kingery received this award. This is the first time a Lioness in the states has received this award. Some of the things said about Linda include: She has led the Lioness Club to be healthy and leaders in their community. Linda is a quiet leader. She leads by example. In watching her leadership style, she is a true Servant Leader. She gives of her time and her talents to lead her club, assist in all projects and partners with the Lions and Leos to serve the community of Priest River. The Priest River Lioness Club is very active and it really is under Linda's leadership, this club has thrived, prospered and grown. This club also sponsored the Bake auction during the Spring conference and raised \$1,800.00 for Camp STIX and Camp Winfield. Our District is very fortunate to have a Lioness club, especially one which is as active as ours is.

Club Inspiration Award: Fairmont and District Lions Club. Fairmont and District Lions Community Den. The club purchased property, with a building and completely renovated the building to be used as a community center for Fairmont. This town did not have any place for community groups to meet, so this club took on the huge project. This project will now serve not only the Lions and give them their own meeting place, but serve their entire community. The building has a full kitchen, with room to expand the building. This project pulled together not only the Lions, but the community, businesses from another Province to assist and other Lions in their Zone. 902.5 hours spent on the actual building, 964 hours spent on fundraising and Community volunteer hours – 151. Building Purchase -\$299,000, with grants received from: Columbia Basin Trust Grant - 100K, Regional District East Kootenay Grant - 25K and Lions Donation - \$174K (13K of this was from Club 50 which raised it 25 years ago and gave it to Lions in trust). Building Renovation (\$8,400 plus 800 volunteer hours), Community and Business Donations (material and services) - \$4,700, Lions Purchase of materials -\$3,700.

This has been a dream of this community for over 25 years, but it took Fairmont and District Lions Club to make this happen. This club has only been around since being chartered in Jan. 2000.

WASHINGTON, D.C. - U.S. Senator Jim Inhofe (R-Okla.) today praised the passage by unanimous consent of his bill (S.1877) clarifying U.S. law to allow **veterans and servicemen not in uniform** to salute the flag.

"The salute is a form of honor and respect, representing pride in one's military service," Senator Inhofe said. "Veterans and service members continue representing the military services even when not in uniform.

"I look forward to seeing those who have served saluting proudly at baseball games, parades, and formal events. I believe this is an appropriate way to honor and recognize the 25 million veterans in the United States who have served in the military and remain as role models to other citizens.
