COOPERATIVE FOR ASSISTANCE AND RELIEF EVERYWHERE (CARE)

In Haiti, many children lack access to quality, basic education. The problem is even greater in the central region of Haiti the number of girls who complete primary education is shockingly low in 2018 more than half of school-age girls in this region did not complete more than 2.5 years of schooling. The government of Haiti is committed to strengthening Girls education and improving opportunities for vocational training. The Ministry of education has developed a 10 year policy and operational plan to foster collaboration across local international and government partners geared toward advancing basic education in Haiti. CARE is partnering with the Haiti government in support of this plan to increase girls' access to education.

We realize that this is a difficult time for everyone and must be even more so for those in need. Encouraging each and every club to help support CARE by making a donation this month. District 19 E is attempting to raise \$4400.00 as our share, but more importantly help support girls aged 10-19 receive a better education. Thank you to Lion Clubs Grand Coulee and Kootenay Lake for already donating to CARE. A \$500.00 donation will earn that club or member a Gordon F Smith Fellowship from MD 19.

LIONS CLUB INTERNATIONAL FOUNDATION (LCIF)

When we kicked off Campaign100 nearly 21/2 years ago we had a goal of reaching \$300 million in donations during that time period. The last figure I saw was donations had exceeded \$160 million with 11/2 year to go as the time period was extended due to Covid 19.

One of the 8 projects that LCIF is focusing on is Diabetes. Diabetes can lead to serious diseases affecting the heart and blood vessels, eyes, kidneys, nerves and teeth. In most high-income countries, diabetes is a leading cause of cardiovascular disease, blindness, kidney failure, and lower limb amputation. It is expected to affect 629 million adults by 2045. World Diabetes Day is November 14th. As LCIF Chair I encourage all members and clubs to consider a donation to LCIF in an effort to help stop Diabetes, and support those already diagnosed.

Please remember that all donations to LCIF go back out in the form of a grant, with no administrative expense.



District 19E Lions Continue to Make Our World Better

A review of the MyLion metrics revealed that ten clubs have reported environment projects this Lion Year. Most of the reporting clubs listed completion of roadside cleanup and eyeglass recycling projects. Creston Lions Club continues to maintain a viewpoint along the highway.

Chewelah Valley Lions have been very active in reporting environment projects. They have a member that works as a volunteer with the Chewelah Land Trust, they have completed roadside cleanup, yard work for a disabled person, maintained flower baskets in town and even participated in a dog rescue project.

Two clubs, Creston and Rosalia, reported working on projects to clean up local cemeteries. Work in the Lister Community Cemetery (Creston) included cleaning and leveling headstones.

And the North Pend Oreille Valley Lions Club completed Phase I of their Bags to Benches project. They collected and recycled over 500 pounds of soft plastic film (such as grocery bags and case overwrap) over a six-month challenge period and earned a Trex bench for their community. The bench has been received, assembled and placed in a prominent location on the main street in Metaline Falls. Phase II will be to earn a bench for the town of Ione and Phase III will be to acquire a bench for the town of Metaline.

**Knights Of The Blind Committee
Endorsed by MD19 Lions Council of Governors**

On October 18, 2020, the Lions Multiple District 19 Council of Governors voted to accept the Lions Knights Of The Blind as an official committee of MD19. The council, made up of District Governors from Washington, British Columbia and northern Idaho districts agreed that a committee devoted to Lions working with and for the blind made sense to help meet Helen Keller's challenge to Lions to be the knights of the blind.

The Knights committee currently has 16 members and are from the 3 regions. PDG Art Ruben said the idea of a Lions committee devoted to the blind and visually impaired came to him recently when he was reminded that Lions in MD19 do a good job to improve and preserve vision, but they come up short helping and working with those who had lost their sight. (Sometimes Lions just don't know how to find the blind, often due to confidentiality and privacy laws.) He wondered how clubs could do more to involve the blind and partially sighted and increase blind members in Lions. "We are the knights of the blind," he said. He knew of few clubs that were involved in projects for the blind like his Everett Central club that has held over 75 salmon fishing derbies for the blind. Over the years he has sponsored seven members who are blind including the current and immediate past president.

Art contacted Council Chair Al Hedstrom about developing a Knights Of The Blind Committee. Al loved the idea and told him to come back with a mission statement, goals and committee members. Art worked with Colette Arvidson of the Anacortes Lions Club and the Washington Council

of the Blind Families Committee. They formulated the mission statement, goals and found Lions and other people to be on the committee. All but three were blind or visually impaired. Three committee members were non-Lions and have agreed to apply for membership. The "Blind" committee has met twice virtually and agreed to the mission statement and goals that were presented at the Council. The committee currently meets on the first Tuesday of each month virtually. They plan on forming committees to meet the goals and selecting officers.

Below is the mission statement and goals of the Knights Of The Blind Committee of MD19.

Our mission statement:

To accept and act upon the Helen Keller challenge made to Lions to become the "Knights Of The Blind," which includes the improvement of the quality of life for people who are blind and visually impaired.

Our Goals:

1. To actively interact with blind and visually impaired individuals in our local communities and listen to their needs.
2. To partner with organizations of and for the blind and visually impaired.
3. To increase membership and support blind and visually impaired in Lions.
4. To assist where possible to obtain tools, devices, information and services to improve access for the blind and visually impaired.
5. To educate and raise awareness of blindness and visual impairment in our local communities.


The committee will reach out to all MD19 clubs to find members who are blind or visually impaired and sighted Lions who are interested in their mission. Among the ideas the committee is to publish a list of events or projects for the blind that clubs are involved with. One of the main objectives of the committee is to encourage all clubs to not only sponsor events with and for the blind but to involve the blind in existing programs and projects and to work with blind organizations on their programs.
