MMR Reports by 1st VDG Harry Lippincott

The most important report in the Lions Organization is the Monthly Membership Report (MMR). This is where you report your new members to LCI. (Oh, and the dropped members, too, but let's not have any of those!) It's important to get your members on and off the roll in a timely manner. It affects dues billing, District numbers, and your members themselves. And, even if you don't have any changes in membership for the month, you still complete a report! That's probably the easiest thing to forget!

The report helps your District Governor Team gauge how well the club is doing. The lack of an MMR report over period of time could mean the club is in trouble and needs help. The Secretary is required to get this report in by the 25^{th} of each month. The report is filed electronically with LCI each month. The Multiple District, District Governor and others who may need to see the report have their own procedures to access the report at LCI.

When the Club's MMR report is filed by the 25th of the month it eliminates the need for follow up by your Club's Zone Chairperson and Vice District Governors.

How about a New Year's resolution to commit to filing your club's MMR by the 25th of each month.
