## DRIVE DOES NOT WORK IF IN PARK OR REVERSE!

Time and energy are needed to be effective in a membership drive. Wanting new members just for numbers does not work. You cannot look at your membership drive in that way. You must have a compelling reason for your membership drive to generate enthusiasm and excitement. It shouldn't be directed to "losing" the ability to continue with what projects your club participates in. It should be directed to what it is that you do! Focus on your successes with service projects and what the future may hold if that prospective member joins the club.

A crucial part in a drive is your members. Members will make it happen, not just the effort. Maybe consider re-orienting your club. Make sure the members are knowledgeable on what it means to be a member in the World's Largest Service Organization. You must be consistent on what it is that you are "selling" so to speak to the prospective members. Members want their opinions to be heard. How can you prepare for a membership drive, if the members are not on board? Yes, you may not get everyone to agree, but if a member is invested in the process then it will lead to a better chance of success.

The club must go into a drive with a goal in mind. Your goal can be set as high as you like, but it must also be reachable. I encourage all clubs to conduct the "Spring Ahead Membership Drive" in March. Your club can be eligible to receive funds of \$300.00. Awarding of funds is based on your clubs membership and percentage increase. This is for the month of March only.

# Welcome to Your Leader Dogs for the Blind A Leader Dog empowers people who are blind with the skills needed for independent daily travel by offering: Guide Dog Training

Leader Dog provides highly-trained, qualified guide dogs to people who are legally blind, 16 years or older, with basic orientation and mobility skills, and can physically and mentally use and care for a dog in the intended manner. In 1991 LDB began providing guide dogs to people who are both hearing and visually impaired.

#### Accelerated Orientation & Mobility Training (commonly known as white cane training)

This residential program pairs clients and instructors 1-to-1 to quickly help clients obtain the basic orientation and mobility skills needed to travel safely with a cane. About 50% of these clients return to train with a Leader Dog.

#### **GPS Training**

Like your cars' GPS, this hand-held technology allows clients to know where they are, what direction they are traveling and what businesses are nearby. All guide dog clients from the U.S. and Canada receive this device free of charge.

### **Summer Experience Camp**

A unique summer camp for teens ages 16 and 17 who are legally blind combines summer fun with an introduction to guide dogs, leadership training and the opportunity to spend time with peers who are facing similar challenges.

I really want to thank all the clubs that gave me gifts and made donations on my behalf to the different charities and foundations. My very gracious thanks to all of you.


It is my wish to see as many of the Lions in our District in Castlegar the end of April as possible, you won't be disappointed, and it's going to be a fun time.
