#### JAFFRAY STUDENT ADVANCES IN LIONS INTERNATIONAL PEACE POSTER CONTEST

Jaffray BC July 4, 2017 – Shelby Wills a grade five student at Jaffray School, has taken the first step to becoming an internationally recognized artist by winning a local competition sponsored by the Sand Creek Lions Club.

Wills' poster was among more than 600,000 entries submitted worldwide in the 30<sup>th</sup> annual Lions International Peace Poster Contest. Lions Clubs International is sponsoring the contest to emphasize the importance of world peace to young people everywhere.

"World Peace has broken through" the 11 year old from Jaffray said. The poster was selected for its originality, artistic merit and portrayal of the contest theme, " A Celebration of Peace." The judging was held on June 28 at Jaffray.

Sand Creek Lions Club Peace Poster Chairman Dean Haarstad said he was impressed by the expression and creativity of the students at Jaffray School. "It is obvious that these young people have strong ideas about what peace means to them. I'm so proud that we were able to provide them with the opportunity to share their visions."

Wills' poster will advance to face stiff competition through the district, multiple district and international rounds of competition if she is to be declared the international grand prize winner." Haarstad said.

One grand prize winner and 23 merit award winners will be selected. The grand prize includes a cash award of US \$5000, plus a trip for the winner and two family members to an award ceremony. The 23 merit award winners will each receive a certificate and a cash award of US \$500.

"Our club is cheering for Shelby as her poster advances in the competition, and we hope that her vision will ultimately be shared with others around the world." Haarstad said.

Locally, Shelby and 22 other students were honoured for their participation by the Sand Creek |Lions Club on June 28 at the Jaffray School.
