Membership: Why is membership important? Three thoughts come to mind immediately: **Service**, **Dues** and **Number of International Directors** (IDs) to represent the United States and Canada (Constitutional Areas 1 and 2).

Service: Our District has been challenged to serve 500,000 in need of help in our district. World-wide, when Lions want to create a partnership with say the Gates Foundation to fight Measles in third world countries it speaks volumes that we serve that 500,000 people this year. For you newer members, we did form such a partnership with Gates Foundation and inoculated 80 million children against measles. We have members doing many service activities within the community which we are starting to report. All of those activities are outreach programs to serve others. The more members on hand to do the work, the more people we can serve.

Dues: We just experienced an increase in Multiple District 19 dues. Operating costs for the office in Bellingham have gone up in the last 6 years (last increase in dues was 6 years ago) and membership has dropped off so fewer members are sharing the expenses. With more members we can help via our dues to ensure that the MD-19 office and their employees/volunteers can properly do their job.

International Directors: Around the world we have 8 Constitutional Areas, we are CA 1. Constitutional Area 1 consists of United States, Puerto Rico, Bahamas and a few other areas in the Caribbean area. Constitutional Area 2 is Canada. The more membership our area has the more International Director representation we have. There are 37 IDs around the world. Constitutional Area 1 would like to have as many IDs as possible so that we can have a larger voice when it comes to voting on any and all procedures pertaining to Constitution and By-laws, LCIF Grants, and the general demeanor of Lions Clubs International.

Childhood Cancer Facts

- **2 minutes** a child is diagnosed with cancer every two minutes
- **13%** increase in incidence of childhood cancer over the last 20 years
- **6 years** average age at diagnosis of children with cancer
- **90%** of childhood cancer deaths occur in low resource settings

LCIF offers grants to Lions districts and multiple districts in amounts from US\$10,000 to US\$150,000. The goal of the LCIF Childhood Cancer Pilot Grant Program is to improve the quality of life for children receiving treatment and their families.

ADMINISTRATION NOTES

Last month I talked about <u>Dues</u>, <u>Nominations & Elections</u> and <u>Training</u>. I am highlighting these subjects again this month.

DUES: A reminder that International sues were due at the end of January. There are still clubs that have not paid. Please do so immediately. MD19 dues were due at the end of February. Have you paid those dues? If not, do so as soon as possible. As I have said, if you are managing the dues collection in your clubs on a timely basis there should not be a reason the dues cannot be paid when due.

NOMINATION & ELECTIONS: The club's nominating committee should have the list of candidates ready to present to the club membership by the 2nd meeting in March (if the club only meets once in March, the candidate list should be presented then). When the list is presented the Club President should announce the election of officers for 2020-2021 year will be held no later than April 15th. Last month, I gave the rationale behind this scheduled as given by LCI. Please refer back to that information.

TRAINING: Club Officers Learning Events will be held on Saturday (May 2nd) in conjunction with District 19E Spring Conference in Coeur d Alene.

New and RETURING officer should plan to attend. Possibly your club has funds to assist with expenses.

DISTRICT CPR (CABINET POSITION RESUSCITATION) By Lyndon Harriman IPDG

I'm sure we've all heard the analogy about the war being lost due to the loss of a horseshoe nail.

Perhaps I can use that story to illustrate what is happening in Lions today at the local level. For want of a Committee chair, a project was not funded. For want of a Sight Chair, local peoples vision suffers. For want of a Treasurer, the club's credit was eliminated, due to non-payment of bills. For want of a Secretary the community was unable to inform members of great community needs. For lack of officers the club board did not exist. For want of a board the President resigned. Due to lack of leaders the Lions Club folded and the community suffered. Almost every local Lions Club is lacking one or more leadership positions. To reverse this trend, we as Lions need to step up.

Now, realize this trend is also happening at the district level. Zones are lacking Chairs; some zones have not had a Zone Chair for several years. This coming year it looks like we will not have Zone Chairs in 7 of the ten zones. Lack of leadership will cause a loss of comradery and exchange of information between clubs. Lack of people willing to step up to serve on the District Cabinet, means the Governor carries an undue burden. They are forced to cover duties for all open positions. There are over 45 positions on the district Cabinet, as of this date a little over half have been filled for the 2020-2021 Lions Year. Each of those positions requires only an hour or so of work each month. Lack of First and Second Vice District Governors, means there will be no leadership in our district. We are at a critical point in Lions, none of us can say we are unable to work and extra 30 minutes each week to fulfill a Lion Cabinet position.

If new leaders don't emerge soon, we are looking at the death knell of Lions as we know it in Canada and the United States. Please consider taking on the duties of a leader and fill a Cabinet position, Leadership Role or take a vacant Zone Chair. Let's work together to reverse this trend in Lions and make our Clubs, Zones and Districts strong and healthy once again.

Global Service Update

According to the MyLion metrics, District 19E clubs have reported a total of 232,493 people served by club activities. Our District goal for the year is 500,000, so we are currently at 46% of that goal. Even though we are over halfway through the Lion Year, I feel that we are on course to meet the goal. Many clubs are most active in the snow-free months. I am also confident that more clubs have been providing service, but have not been reporting it. Of the 47 clubs in District 19E, 29 are reporting their service activities in MyLion. That equates to 62% of our clubs that are reporting. Please, let me, DG Frank or PDG Harry Lippincott know if your secretary is having difficulty reporting in MyLion – we are here to help!

At this time, three clubs, **Green Bluff, Hauser** and **North Pend Oreille Valley Lions Clubs**, have completed and reported projects for all five Global Causes and are eligible to win up to \$200.00 to help defray the costs of their projects. And five clubs (**Chewelah Valley, Lake Windermere, Medical Lake, Rathdrum** and **Spokane Shadle North Lions Clubs**) have completed and reported service projects for three of the five Global Causes.

Start planning now to complete projects in all five Global Causes (Diabetes, Environment, Hunger, Vision and Pediatric Cancer)!

Think Green – Even While You Are Surrounded by White

Just because it's winter and a blanket of snow covers the ground, doesn't mean that there aren't things you can do to help protect our environment. Here are a few small changes that you can make around your home now that can add up to big impacts over time:

- Adjust heat thermostats two degrees to save 2,000 pounds of carbon dioxide a year. (This also applies to air conditioning too.)
- Change heating filters to save 350 pounds of carbon dioxide a year.
- Insulate your home. Have an energy audit.
- Purchase energy-efficient appliances.
- When not in use, turn off electrical appliances.
- Replace incandescent light bulbs with compact fluorescent light bulbs to reduce energy consumption 60%.
- Use rechargeable batteries.
- Reduce the temperature of water heaters by 10 degrees.
- Install water-saving devices in showers and toilets.
- Wash only full loads of laundry.
- Wash clothes in warm or cold water. Use low phosphate laundry detergent.
- Use cloth dishtowels and napkins instead of paper towels and napkins.
- Purchase non-perishable items in bulk.
- Use reusable string or fabric shopping bags.

And start thinking about the coming Spring. The groundhog didn't see his shadow this year, so an early Spring is the forecast. Maybe your club can work with local kids to plant community gardens to raise produce to be donated to seniors and/or food banks. Now's the time to plan.
