I don't think it can be stated enough times about the importance of having leadership in place at the local, district, multiple district and national levels. Unfortunately, as mentioned many times in the past several months, if things don't change that's exactly what's going to happen at district 19 E.

The 2020-2021 list of cabinet members is provided with some additions and changes, and I want to thank those members who have stepped into the roles of leadership. CHILDHOOD CANCER VDG/DGE Peggy Harriman



At a time when the world is dealing with and focusing on the pandemic, let's not forget the children diagnosed with cancer. Remember that cancer doesn't take a break and over 300,000 children are diagnosed each year. They and their families need our support, so if you can, support LCIF and/or your cancer centers.

It's also important to remember that grants are available to Lions districts and multiple districts in amounts from US\$10,000 to US\$150,000. Projects must be implemented in coordination or collaboration with existing government or charitable childhood cancer medical facilities. And, if an applicant wishes to implement a project involving medical equipment or infrastructure, they may be eligible to apply for support though the LCIF Matching grant program.

CLUB VISITATIONS VDG/DGE Peggy Harriman

I must tell you that this topic, among others, have been weighing heavy on my heart and in my thoughts due to this pandemic. This is a responsibility that clubs agree to do under the Standard Club Constitution and By Laws. It is hoped that clubs would be respectful of their responsibilities as being part of a larger organization.

MONTHLY MEMBERSHIP REPORTS: As I said last month I really thought that with clubs not meeting due to the COVID-19 that it would be possible to achieve 100% reporting. Didn't make it as a few clubs that are chronically late or never report again did not report. As above, the Monthly Membership Reporting is responsibility of clubs under the Club Standard Constitution and By Laws.

These are subject items covered when the District Officer Training is held. A third major responsibility under the Standard Club Constitution and By Laws is to pay dues timely. Many officers do not attend this training resulting in the district not being in what is called "Good Standing".

To support the incredible men and women serving with us, the International Board of Directors has passed a resolution to help our clubs.

Here is an overview of the resolution approved by the Board of Directors:

Flexible payments – No clubs will be suspended or cancelled through December 31, 2020 for late payment of dues.

Charter and entrance fees waiver – We have waived all charter and entrance fees from July 1 – December 31, 2020. These measures will help Lions facing financial hardships, and give our clubs hope, encouragement, and an opportunity to start the new Lion year with renewed energy and optimism.

This may be a time of great need, but we will overcome this together. For more than a century, Lions have taken on the greatest challenges facing humanity. That is who we are, and what we do.

So let us stand together. And let us remember just how important we are to our communities and the world.

RETENTION MARGE BEGA

Lions Club International Foundation

We approved 69 grants for \$3,559,090 for the full realm of our global service projects including our first grants for Hunger and Childhood Cancer. (This does not include the 218 COVID-19 LCIF Emergency Grants that total \$3.5) That means we have spent over \$7M to fund grants, in the last two months. We need to replenish this money.

Our investments have taken a huge hit, but they have outperformed the market by 2%, so we have our money well invested, even for volatile markets. Campaign100 has been extneded until the end of the 2021-2022 fiscal year.

NOTE: The above comments are from PID Joe Preston that he sent out to Coordinators earlier this week. They are as a result of the Board of Trustees meeting held recently.

Through the end of April District 19E has donations of \$36,600 thank you to every club and individual that has donated to LCIF. PID Joe stated above we need to replenish funds. We have just 1 month left to achieve our goal of \$41,000. More importantly than achieving a goal is the 800 million individuals that go to bed hungry, children that have type 1 diabetes, children with cancer, individuals that do not have clean dinking water. The list goes on and on.

Members the U.S. received a generous gift from the government. I encourage you to consider donating a portion of that gift to LCIF. I realize some individuals this was needed financial help and probably can't and that's OK, while others it was in addition to what was already available. In an email from President Choi a few weeks ago he stated while we can't serve with our hands we can serve financially.

Best and quickest way to donate is go to LCI (<u>www.lionsclubs.org</u>) and select donate button. From there follow the prompts. You will need member ID and club#.

You never know where you will find a new opportunity to serve. North Pend Oreille Valley Lions Club have embarked on a new environmental service project thanks to a post by Past Council Chair Steve Somerset on the Lions of MD19 Facebook page.



PCC Steve attended a Virtual Lions Symposium sponsored by the Young Lions Task Torce where he learned about a recycling program by a company called Trex. You may have heard of them; Trex manufactures wood-alternative decking, railings and other outdoor items from recycled materials.

The Trex Company has hosted the Recycling Challenge since 2006, with the objective of educating public on the importance of plastic film recycling through school and community recycling programs. Participants collect plastic film with the goal of recycling a minimum of 500 pounds of plastic in a 6-month period. If the goal is met the group is awarded a Trex bench. *Each participating organization is only eligible for one bench in a six month period regardless of how many pounds are recycled passed the 500 pounds.*

The plastic film that qualifies includes: grocery bags, bread bags, bubble wrap, dry cleaning bags, newspaper sleeves, ice bags, plastic shipping envelopes, cereal bags, case overwrap, salt bags, stretch film, wood pellet bags and produce bags. All bags must be clean, dry and free from food residue.

Trex provides two recycling bins and can supply more if needed. The collected bags are delivered to a participating store to be recycled through a reverse logistics channel. The stores prefer small, frequent deliveries of bags of plastic and will not accept bulk delivers of bags. Participating collection locations include:

- Washington Albertsons, Bi-Mart, Fred Meyer, Kohl's, Safeway, Target and Winco
- ➤ Idaho Albertsons, Fred Meyer, Kohl's, Safeway, Smiths and Winco
- British Columbia Safeway and Federated CO-OP

With the current situation, many grocery stores are not allowing patrons to present reusable bags for sacking their groceries and are instead bagging them in single-use plastic bags. NPOV Lions will be providing a way for people in their community to dispose of the plethora of plastic grocery bags while aiming for a new bench to place where everyone can enjoy it.
