



CHILDHOOD CANCER

Do you know a child or teen currently undergoing cancer treatment? There are some terrific books published by the American Childhood Cancer Organization (ACCO, based in Maryland) specifically for these kids. Here is a sample:



Chemo, Craziness & Comfort - Warm and funny illustrations help kids ages 6-12 make sense of cancer and its treatments.



Journal - Fun images and writing prompts help kids and teens express their thoughts and feelings during a difficult time. Plus word-find and drawing activities.




Marvelous Marleigh - For ages 1-5, with photos of a precious Spokane girl who was diagnosed with leukemia at age 4. Young kids with cancer can identify with Marleigh's treatments and hospital stays.

There is also a book for siblings and several for parents, plus a medical play kit with simulated instruments to help kids better understand tests and treatments and overcome their fears. Shipping costs are pretty high for individual items but drop considerably when ordering larger quantities. If you don't have anyone in particular to buy for, the Inland Northwest affiliate of ACCO, https://www.acco.org/inlandnw/ (ACCOIN, based in Spokane) welcomes donations of books and play kits to give to kids in treatment at Sacred Heart Children's Hospital. I'm sure other children's hospitals that treat kids with cancer would also be grateful to have these items for their patients.

LIONS CLUB INTERNATIONAL FOUNDATION (LCIF)

District Club Grant Program (DCG) is a relative new grant program which started about 3 years ago. This grant program was started by LCIF as many clubs indicated they wanted to use funds in their own community. LCIF heard those concerns and responded by starting the DCG program. The club must donate \$5000.00 the preceding year to LCIF or the district donates \$10,000 the preceding year. The club or district then receives 15 % of the donation providing the funds are not designated for a certain program, example hearing, childhood cancer, diabetes etc. Earned funds remain in the club/district account for 15 years. District 19 E has had multiple clubs donate over \$5000.00 a year but some of the funds were designated.

There is so much more I could tell you but I want you to know 19 E recently received a grant for around \$7500.00-\$8000.00 for the City of Malden. The fire they encountered last summer destroyed the community center. With DCG we were able to secure the funds and purchase a commercial refrigerator/freezer, commercial stove, commercial microwave and folding tables. During the first 3 years of the program the district had built a kitty of around \$3000.00 each year. This was a result of donations from clubs that were not designated.

Here are a couple of things to know and remember. 1) Non designated funds or Empowering Service Funds are what earn 15%. 2) All donations from club, members or outside of Lions show in the club total. 3) All donations go towards Melvin Jones Fellowship. 4) The club does not earn any credit until it donates \$5000.00 unrestricted funds in a given year, at that time the club would have \$750.00 for their use within the next 15 years.

Also I want to encourage clubs to nominate and elect a club LCIF Coordinator for next year. Typically this is supposed to be the immediate past president but many clubs nominate, or the new president appoints. Also please include LCIF in your annual budget for next year.

Best way to donate is log onto the LCI website and select DONATE.



COVID and LDB: With the increase in COVID cases nationwide, LDB made the decision to continue guide dog and Orientation & Mobility training through home delivery for the months of December and January. They are monitoring the status of the pandemic closely and will make the determination to resume on-campus training as soon as it is safe to do so. When they resume, they will continue to adhere to the strict safety protocols they followed in the fall including: social distancing, 2:1 ratio of

client to guide dog mobility instructor (GDMI) versus the usual 4:1 ratio, and operating at 50% class capacity so they can use every other residence hall room.



INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION---JUNE 25-29, 2021



Dear Lion Leader,

Due to the continuing concerns about the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, the board of directors voted to transition the 2021 Montreal Lions Clubs International Convention to a virtual event that will be delivered totally online. This decision was made with the health and safety of our Lions, staff and vendors in mind as limiting international travel and large gatherings is key to global containment strategies.

Although we are disappointed that we won't be able to host this event in person, we are excited about hosting our first virtual international convention that can safely connect Lions from around the world. We are still finalizing the details of your new convention experience, and will share those with you as soon as they are ready.

Here are some important details about the 2021 virtual convention we'd like to share with you:

- Everyone's invited Our 2021 convention will be a virtual event that's open to all Lions and Leos around the world.
- Registration fees The registration fee will be US\$50 until March 31, then US\$75 beginning April 1. The registration fee for Leos will be US\$30 regardless of date. Convention is currently scheduled for June 25-29. Additional event and registration details will be provided soon.
- Current registrants Lions who are currently registered for convention will receive an email soon with more information about their registration options.
- Elections Executive officer and international director elections will be conducted electronically, and voting procedures will be forthcoming.
- Convention updates Check our convention website <u>LCICon</u> for convention updates and details as they become available.

This global health pandemic has forced us all to make decisions and changes that place health and safety first. However, we are optimistic that with each new day there is hope, and as Lions, we continue to find new ways to stay connected, safely serve our communities and continue our global mission of service.
