Northwest Lions Foundation

What is the NLF? It is a place that your club can go and get help with Hearing, Patient Care Program, Project Support Grants, and the Health Screening Unit.

The Hearing Aid Program: Provides new hearing aids to people who cannot afford them. The Club gathers information to verify that the person is in need, then if the applicant is approved they send the request to the NLF. The cost is 50-50 with Clubs

Patient Care Program: For assistance with vision care, treatment, surgery or assistive technology. The cost is 50-50

Project Support Grants: These are formal organizational grants and require a formal grant application to be completed and submitted semi-annually.

Lions Health Screening Unit: The LHSU is for clubs to use as needed, you just need to ask. We also have a mini unit.

To offer these things to your Clubs it takes funds. These funds are generated from the money that the NLF receives from the White Cane Days, or your Club makes a donation. So please send some money to the NLF, we are down \$20,000. The more the NLF has the more help we can do for your club.
