# Saturday Banquet – Flow Cytometer Fighting Children's Cancer Grand Chute Ballroom

<u>Katie Pitterle</u>, will tell her story of fighting her childhood cancer. <u>Lion Sri Vasudevan</u>, will fill us in on the efforts of Lions and Lioness Clubs across the state of Wisconsin to fund and purchase a Flow Cytometer which is a cutting edge tool for the treatment of Childhood Cancer. The machine takes cells from young cancer patients, "super charges" them with cancer fighting antibodies and infuses them back into the patient. This process dramatically improves the odds of cancer treatment success. It is noteworthy that the largest portion of the District funds raised statewide came from District 27 B2.
