

MyLion and Service Reporting



LCI discontinued the service activity portion of MyLCI in June of this year. All service activities are now reported via the MyLion which is available on the web or as a mobile app. MyLion allows entering activities by not only clubs, but individual Lions which can then be submitted (with one button) by club presidents, secretaries, service chairs, or administrators. If you were unsuccessful in the past, please try again, as many improvements have been made in the last 60 days. Your district team is available to assist in training for MyLion, just ask. In our district, 11 clubs report during a 12 month period with 10 of those re-

porting no less than every 6 months. Please make an effort to report your service every month.

Now is the time to move our projects forward. We are 45 years young, and still growing! With the CubSight program firmly established and under the leadership of Walter Peat, we now need to focus on other areas of service, through a new program that would involve you, and your Lion service partners, in the vision care of those with diabetes, glaucoma, or seniors in need of vision care. I hope to roll out a mobile system of eye screening equipment that can be deployed around the state to accomplish the task of bringing better quality of life through vision care.

Our eyeglass recycling program, while still bringing in record number of used glasses, needed some committed group to help with the sorting, grading, and packaging of these much needed pieces of life changing eye wear. Our Executive Director, Lion Chris Carlone, took it upon himself to partner with a local sheriff's department and get inmate trustees to do the task. Now we are back on track and reducing the back log of collected glasses so that those in other countries might receive the gift of vision. But we can still be involved in the sorting and cleaning of these glasses at service projects across the state.

I urge you, no I challenge you, to become greater involved with your foundation and with your fellow Lions. I invite you to come to a meeting of the LLEF in your district or one close by. This year we are hosting celebrations of our 45th year in four of the five districts in the state. We will kick things off in New Orleans at our home coming annual meeting a super party featuring, great food, prizes and the drawing of the Big Time Raffle Winners! Next, in November, we will be in Opelousas for the Cracklin' Festival and be hosted by the Port Barre Lions Club. had been preparing for this for quite some time, the moment was quite overwhelming as 730+ Lions accepted responsibility for their areas for the year 2019-2020.



to work the fields. After living on the plantation, in two moves we ended up on 12 ¼ acres south of Sibley, where my real world began. My mother worked at what was known as the "shell plant" until my father went into the road construction business. From running an asphalt roller on road jobs at 8 years old to driving a gravel truck hauling sand/gravel at 14, my father did not see age as a barrier to when my work career was to begin. He told me how to do something, one (1) time, he never had to repeat his instructions. He was not a mean person, just figured one time was enough, so listen well I did.

The Sibley Lions Club was formed in 1959 with my father as a charter member. So, from that date forward our world was all around work and service projects for the Lions Club. From fish fries to benefit projects for children to rebuilding the baseball park for our local high school, service for all but yourself was the motto in our home.

At 18 years old and going into my 2nd year at Louisiana Tech, the yearning to finally become a Lion was satisfied in 1969. Having joined the Circle K Club at Tech, an oncampus service organization to help projects in need helped fill a gap, but it just wasn't the same. Being a Lion was it.

Fast forward a few years, money ran out at Tech. Ended up going to work for Uncle Sam in June 1970. Trained in communications, eventually became a Communications Training NCO, stent at Barksdale and at Zwiebrucken Air Base in Germany. Separated in 1977 with the rank of Staff Sergeant.

Have been a certified water/boating safety instructor for 17 years. Taught classes at LSUS, Cross Lake, Kinsey Boy Scout Ranch, Lake O' The Pines and the Shreveport Police Department Marine Division. Developed a safety program that was chosen by the Houston Safe Boating Council to teach as their basic program. For the work on that program, was commissioned an Admiral in the Texas Navy by then Governor Rick Perry in 2011. Dallas is currently looking at adopting the program as well. Having past all tests and requirements, am a certified instructor for Texas Department of Parks and Wildlife.

Have been a member of the United States Power Squadron for 19 years. Am currently National Past Vice Commander having been over all squadron activities in 453 squadrons, 34,000 members which included Japan, Hawaii, Continental United States, Puerto Rico and surrounding islands.

The time spent with the Sibley Lions Club lasted 20 years, until 1989. Having been President twice, Zone Chairman twice and back then, Deputy District Governor once. Stayed out of Lions for years due to out of town work and rejoined after retirement in 2012. Since then have spent tenure on the Minden Lions Club Board of Directors, Past President, 2017-2018, in which we were blessed with the Club Excellence Award, Chair of our Eyeglasses/Cubsight program, Membership Chair, 2018-2019, in which we received the net club membership growth award, member of the LLEF Advisory Board, member of the MD8 Club Development Project, Zone Chairman 2018-2019 and elected 2nd Vice Governor for 2019-2020.

My work career had been centered around purchasing and inventory control for local manufacturing plants, car/truck dealerships, an oil field service company and ownership of a farm and tractor equipment dealership.

My wife, of soon to be 48 years, has her master's degree in music education and is now retired with 27 years of service with the Webster Parish School System. But what few people don't know is that she taught piano to private students not only at our home but in a converted flight line van for 17 years. She would go to the schools and teach in the van. This venture was featured in a documentary published in The Shreveport Journal years ago.

Cindy and I had 4 children, one daughter and three sons. Daughter had 5 children; sons had 3. Our youngest son, Joshua, a Sgt. in the U.S. Army, was killed in Iraq in 2006 at the age of 21. He had one of the children, a son. Our lives changed the day he died.
