Happy New Year! We are half way through our Lion year and goodness gracious, I hope 2021 gives us a break! It has been such chaos.

My wish for this coming year is for each Lion to realize that HE or SHE are the leaders of this organization. I need ALL of you to a) recognize that, b) take a deep breath and c) step up to serve in your club, your region, your district or your multiple-district!

With less than 6 months left in this Lion year, everyone needs to be thinking about club leadership. By February, your executive committee/board of directors should be discussing potential leaders for the coming year. LCI asks us to submit our newly elected leaders by May 15th. If you work backwards, you need to start your election process no later than April 1—and clubs that meet once or twice monthly may need to begin as early as February. Encourage members early to take leadership.

Club stability rests on several supports. One is officer succession. If your club does not have at least a 2 year plan, you are potentially destabilizing your club and making your organizational work harder. Select at least one vice-president who will know in advance that that he/she will take the role of president in the coming term—whether that is a 1 or 2 year term. Start right now moving towards club officer stability!

Officers need training. I have applied for an received a grant for our district to provide officer training tentatively scheduled for early May. Those who have been in a position for a long time also need to be at training—not just to pick up new things for each new year, but to assist in training!

If your officers would prefer not to attend, I can come to YOUR club and do a personalized training session for your officers. Just contact me to set up a training session for your club PRIOR to July 1.





Greetings Fellow Lions!

As your district 8L service chairperson, I wanted to share with everyone about what we are doing to promote and encourage service reporting.

Reporting your service hours in MYLION is very necessary in order for LCI to know what we, Lions, on the ground are doing. LCI takes this information to large fortune 500 organizations and this helps get grant money for future grants such as disasters, projects, education and etc. In this Lions year, 4 of our 5 districts have had to apply for \$10,000 grants due to hurricane damage. LCI came through for us once again! Reporting our hours helps show them what we are doing as volunteers on the ground level.

Also, we need to show others what we are doing. We need to get the word out that we are doing something! I know all of our clubs are volunteering and helping others, but I see little documented in MYLION. Only a few clubs are putting in their service hours and I KNOW we are all doing great jobs. Even with COVID, we continue to help others.

As I make club visits with our district governor, I am handing out information on why reporting service matters. I have recommended that these club presidents appoint a club service chairperson in LCI to take on this responsibility. Also, start off each club meeting with: "Who has volunteer hours?" or pass out a form that members can write down their volunteer hours. We have had 2-3 extra clubs do this and started reporting. So, THANK YOU ALL!




CLUB EXCELLENCE 2019-2020

District 8L Legacy Project Update




