

lives. Several of our multi-district Lions have succumbed to the ravages of this virus. Many have contracted the virus and survived. In that we are very thankful.

If you have someone in your club who has contracted COVID—please let me know as I am keeping a prayer list of those who have been infected.

As Lions we must look to what we can do with where we are and how we can move forward. Some clubs are donating time and money to food banks, some Lions are sewing masks for family and neighbors as well as medical staff.

I thought I was finished with my message, but I have just been notified that our district has received an LCIF Emergency Grant for \$10,000 which can be used to purchase medical supplies in our area. I specified Caddo/Bossier parishes, because at the time, that was where the biggest need was. However as time has passed, many agencies have beat the bushes to procure medical supplies, The need here has dropped just a bit, so if you know of any emergency services or even nursing homes who need the N95 masks, send me an email outlining the need.

I also prepared some masks with the LCIF logo on them, however I failed to gain written permission to do so, and therefore, I must wait until I get permission (or

not) before I give them out. KaSondra from LCIF is working that for me to see if we can get that pushed through, even though the LCI offices are shut down. Many of the LCI staff are working from home, so it is possible to get something done via email, but don't bother calling LCI office.

Meanwhile—ALL OF YOU... keep yourselves safe, and think of creative ways to serve from a distance. Let me know if there is something I can do for you or your club.
