PDG Association, a trustee of the New York State and Bermuda Lions Foundation, and was appointed as the Lions representative to UNICEF-New York from 2012-2014. He has served on the USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum Planning and Host Committees and has been a presenter at several USA/Canada Forums.

In recognition of his service to the association, he has received numerous awards including the club Lion of the Year, Club President's Award, the Robert J. Uplinger Service Award, several District Governor Appreciation Awards, and the Multiple District Membership Growth Award. He is also the recipient of numerous International President's Certificates of Appreciation, seven International President's Awards and the Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honor the association bestows upon its members. He is a Dr. Franklin G. Mason Fellow, a W. P. Woods Fellow and a progressive Melvin Jones Fellow.

In addition to his Lions activities, President Alexander is active in numerous professional and community organizations. He has served as chairperson of the advisory board for the New York Urban League and as a board member of the St. Francis DeSales School for the Deaf. He is also a recipient of the Congressional Record Award.

President Alexander has two daughters, and his partner in service, Shabiki Cazabon, is a Lion and a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow.



This grant will cover the purchase of an emergency trailer for Lions to use in the event of natural disasters. The program will also include training for volunteers prior to disasters to prepare to assist communities in recovery. Supplies which will be included in the Lions disaster van such as blankets, safety vests, a generator, tools, coolers, tables and chairs, and more. Clubs and individual Lions can commit to donate \$50.00 annually to the 32S Alert Fund to restock and supplement the Alert van's needs. As part of our ongoing efforts to maintain a strong presence in our community, LVS has taken up the task of meeting with each member of South Carolina's Congressional Delegation. The purpose of these meetings is to: (1) establish a reliable point of contact and open lines of communication with our elected officials; (2) ask each Senator and Congressman to make a public statement on the importance of vision health by joining the Congressional Vision Caucus; and (3) make funding for LVS a priority in their community.



I am pleased to report that I have had productive meetings with representatives from Senator Tim Scott, Congressman Jeff Duncan, Congressman William Timmons, and Congressman Ralph Norman. Incoming District Governor, Jim Barbare, and LVS Board member, Dr. Nick McLane, were able to join me for our meeting with Congressman Timmons (left).

These connections are vital to maintain effective partnerships across SC. We look forward to increasing our presence with and impact through our Congressional Delegation in the coming year.

On June 24, 2021, LVS celebrated our 52nd anniversary with a virtual event. The program included an introduction to our County Needs Assessment that will be shared in our Annual Report in a few weeks, an overview of our capacity-building initiative known as the Catalyst Campaign, and an interview with our newest International Director, ID Dr. Dianne Pitts. If you missed it, I encourage you to watch the recording on our YouTube channel and stay on the lookout for our Annual Report – you won't want to miss it!



Beyond these exciting milestones, we rounded out our fiscal year with two additional emergency eye surgeries in June: a shunt operation for Mary of Myrtle Beach and a retina detachment fix for Sonya of Charleston. Both procedures underscore the urgency of our work and its profound impact on the lives we touch. Together, we will achieve even more in the coming year as we increase our capacity and improve vision health for all South Carolinians!


FROM THE DESK OF DG JIM BARBARE DISTRICT 32 S


A white 6 X 12-foot enclosed trailer is being purchased. It will be stocked with emergency supplies.

We hosted a blood drive at Benson Automotive on May 21 which resulted in approximately 25 donors. The blood supply has been greatly impacted by COVID and consistent donors




