

#### **Dear Lion Leader,**

Due to the continuing concerns about the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, the board of directors voted to transition the 2021 Montreal Lions Clubs International Convention to a virtual event that will be delivered totally online. This decision was made with the health and safety of our Lions, staff and vendors in mind as limiting international travel and large gatherings is key to global containment strategies.

Although we are disappointed that we won't be able to host this event in person, we are excited about hosting our first virtual international convention that can safely connect Lions from around the world. We are still finalizing the details of your new convention experience, and will share those with you as soon as they are ready.

Here are some important details about the 2021 virtual convention we'd like to share with you:

- **Everyone's invited** Our 2021 convention will be a virtual event that's open to all Lions and Leos around the world.
- Registration fees The registration fee will be US\$50 until March 31, then US\$75 beginning April
   The registration fee for Leos will be US\$30 regardless of date. Convention is currently scheduled for June 25-29. Additional event and registration details will be provided soon.
- **Current registrants** Lions who are currently registered for convention will receive an email soon with more information about their registration options.
- **Elections** Executive officer and international director elections will be conducted electronically, and voting procedures will be forthcoming.
- Convention updates Check our convention website <u>LCICon</u> for convention updates and details as they become available.

This global health pandemic has forced us all to make decisions and changes that place health and safety first. However, we are optimistic that with each new day there is hope, and as Lions, we continue to find new ways to stay connected, safely serve our communities and continue our global mission of service.

We appreciate your understanding during this challenging time for our organization and the world, and thank you for your incredible service as a Lion.

#### Dear Lions,

It is a great privilege to be writing to you in my new role as President & CEO of Lions Vision Services. Fifty-two years ago, our fellow Lions were organizing the MD State Convention that would result in the chartering of LVS: our state Lions charity for sight conservation in South Carolina. We stand on their shoulders and carry their legacy forward in our continued work.

That work is a team effort, and I'm excited to say I am not the only "new" face in a new role that is no stranger to South Carolina Lions. On January 1<sup>st</sup> my nonprofit colleague, Lion Mary Louise Resch, joined the LVS Board as our Secretary, a position that has been vacant since the unexpected and tragic death of Lion Mike Rakes due to COVID-19 last fall.

Mary Louise is a dedicated Lion, an extraordinary fundraiser, and a respected nonprofit leader in South Carolina. She currently serves as the Director of Philanthropy at Central SC Habitat for Humanity. We are incredibly fortunate to have her in a key leadership position on our Board.

The new year marks the midpoint of our fiscal year, one which has been filled with challenges as we respond to a global pandemic and an already growing demand for our vision health services. Addressing those demands requires financial support from our Lions Clubs and Lions Members.

I am pleased to report that as of January 29<sup>th</sup> we have received \$54,520 in Club Contributions to LVS with 30% of Clubs contributing. Supplemental funding from partnerships with the Dorothy D. Smith Charitable Foundation, UnitedHealthcare, Coastal Community Foundation, and others has allowed us to achieve unprecedented levels of service in the first half of our fiscal year.

With the rise in demand for eye surgeries, these sources of funding have been exhausted. We need your help to continue this work. Even if your Club has been struggling with fundraising this year, we are asking for every Lions Club to make a gift of some amount to LVS by our State Convention in April. We are also asking every Lions Club member to make one \$50 gift to LVS by June 30, 2021. We have a special online giving day coming on May 4<sup>th</sup>.

Your support at any level is crucial to our organization at this time. You enable us to save sight, to take every \$1 donated and provide \$5 in services, to be a beacon of hope to those living on rough seas of life. Where there's a need, there's a Lion, and we need you now.

As you are probably now aware, due to continuing concerns about the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, the Board of Directors voted to transition the 2021 Lions Clubs International Convention to a virtual event that will be held entirely online.

For many of us making the financial investment to attend our International Conventions is a source of great pride and faith in our Association. The announcement that the face-to-face Convention has been cancelled will come as a

disappointment because it is an event that we all look forward to with great anticipation to demonstrate our commitment to Lionism. It is this kind of commitment that sustains the vitality of our movement.

Lions everywhere are equally excited about the opportunity to participate in an International Convention without the jet lag and hefty price tag of international travel! This year, the cost is a super-low \$50 if you register by March 31, 2021. For some, this may be the best opportunity to participate in one of our International Conventions!

The final schedule hasn't been published yet, but there are plans for Lions information, education and training to be offered to attendees. As you register to attend, please remember to complete the delegate seating process, if you are selected as one of the club's delegates. Every Lions Club in good standing may seat at least one delegate and one alternate for every 25 members, or major fraction thereof.

Even though we will not be going to Montreal, there continues to be people in need around the world. LCIF can only meet these needs with our help. With this in mind, we have a suggestion that many of you will welcome. We are asking you to consider keeping your commitment alive by contributing to LCIF a portion of the investment you would have made to attend the Convention (great savings on registration, travel, accommodations and meals). We encourage you to see a donation of at least US\$100.00 as a way of keeping alive the pride and faith you take in attending our Convention. Of course, any amount over this will be appreciated. How do you suppose the above message applies to Lions and Membership in Lions Clubs across our Multiple District and perhaps all of North America?

Let me see if I can help relate those words of wisdom to our problem of the diminishing number of Members of our Lions Clubs. First of all: We have known for many years that we have a problem with the continued loss of Membership! So we have admitted that we have a problem and we have continued to do all we can (at least some have) to fight the problem without success in stopping the continued loss of members. So maybe it is time for us to ACCEPT that the problem exists and stop fighting the problem!

Now, if we accept the fact that the problem is going to continue and begin to ask ourselves WHY does it continue to exist, maybe then we will be able to provide a solution to the problem. I think I know what the major problems are and would like to share my thoughts with you this month!

First of all, we have too many Members of our Lions Clubs who are unwilling to "Ask" a friend, family member, or acquaintance if they might be interested in joining us in a Service Project of maybe just come to a meeting and find out what we are doing to Serve our Community as Lions! The only way to become a member of our Lions Clubs is to be asked to join.

Secondly, we have too many Members who are not committed to Serving their Community in any way, shape or form! All they are interested in is coming to a meeting and socializing with the other members. Please don't ask them to help with a Service Project, because they are too busy to lend a hand! Without Lions to help with the Service Projects, the projects do not get done!

The last thought I would like to share with you is that we have far too many Lions Clubs that do nothing to SERVE their communities other than provide a pair of glasses to a member of the Community and their primary purpose is to find ways to raise funds to pay for the glasses or find a way to donate the money raised for some other Non- Lion project in town. Most of these Clubs would not think twice about making a donation to LCIF, South Carolina Lions Vision Services, Leader Dogs for the Blind, or the Storm Eye Institute and MUSC in Charleston. In addition, most of the members of these clubs seldom ever think of making a personal donation to any of the above Lions Organizations. Fund raising is NOT Service work! Without Service work in our communities, we have no reason to invite others to join!

When the above problems are rectified, maybe Lions Clubs International and our Local Lions Clubs will stop losing more members than we find to join and begin to grow into the powerful Pride we were 40 or 50 years ago. In the meantime, the true Lions (Loving Individuals Offering Needed Service) will continue to provide all the Service we are capable of and love every minute we spend providing those services! WE SERVE!

#### FROM THE DESK OF PCC PAUL DOVE, GLOBAL SERVICE CHAIR

Welcome to the downhill portion of fiscal year 2020-2021. We are a month past the halfway mark. Our District Governors have been running full steam to achieve their goals and keep the locomotive on the tracks and headed towards the station.

Our other leaders, including zone chairs and club presidents, have been exerting their best efforts to achieve the service, membership satisfaction, and club growth goals they set.

Sadly, four of our MD 32 clubs have folded, died, turned in their charters. But we do have one newly chartered club, the South Carolina Lions Cyber Club, which is off and running.

Our NAMI team has followed the team/vision/plan/success process to the letter, and we are not hemorrhaging membership as bloodily as we have in too many of the last thirty years. In fact, the Constitutional Areas One and Two pilot NAMI program is posting sufficient success to garner the attention of other Constitutional Areas worldwide, according to the January 4 NAMI webinar.

PID Gene Spiess told my 2016-2017 class of district governors-elect that, no matter how much preparation and planning and action we have taken, we were already behind, that the year would fly by. Prophets are too often taken for being excessive in their pronouncements; PID Gene was not excessive in preaching this to us.

So, bottom line, what can we do between now and June 30 to facilitate our leaders' hard work and help them reach their ambitious goals? May I recommend the following?

Report you service activities to your club service chair (or secretary if no CSC)

- ⇒ Identify and invite a prospective new club member to visit your meeting, even if your club is only meeting virtually
- ⇒ Canvas your neck of the woods to determine where a new Lions Club could make a difference and identify the mover/ shaker who could be the catalyst necessary to make that new club happen
- ⇒ Discuss and follow through on a club branch your club could sponsor which could lead down the road to a new club
- ⇒ Rejuvenate your district with a new club
- ⇒ Revitalize your club through new service projects
- ⇒ Re-motivate your club by engaging members in service work and fundraising and membership recruitment
- ⇒ Identify and recruit and orient your FY 2021-2022 club officers, giving newer members the opportunity to become leaders
- ⇒ Begin planning your FY 2021-2022 club budget and how you will raise funds and how you will use those funds for service work
- ⇒ Register for your district's February convention and the April state convention
- ⇒ Participate in zone and cabinet meetings
- ⇒ If you are or have been a club president, consider volunteering to serve as a zone chair
- ⇒ If you have served as a zone chair, consider a district office—we are always looking for strong, dedicated Lion leaders at all levels. To me, one of the hardest jobs our district governors have is finding Lions willing to step up to the next level and continue to move us forward
- ⇒ Recommend a new service project that you see as a significant community need
- ⇒ Publicize you club, wear your pin, let friends and neighbors and relatives know what you as a Lion stand for and actually do
- ⇒ Thank your leaders for their valiant efforts to keep this train on track and as at full a throttle as possible

During this time of pandemic and national distress, let's focus on what gives us pleasure and boosts our spirits---things like family, faith, health, happiness, and being an MD 32 Lion! Because we serve, we are special. We have much to celebrate and for which to be thankful.

#### The Seven Types of Lions Memberships

- Active—all rights and privileges of membership and pays dues
- Associate—member who hold primary membership in another club and pays dues
- Affiliate—member not able to participate but desires to support club and its community service and pays dues
- Member-at-Large—Member who has moved from community or no longer able to participate and pays dues

#### The following categories dues are usually paid by the club, not the individual

- Honorary—non-member who has performed outstanding community service and on whom club wishes to bestow special recognition
- Privileged-- member for 15 or more years who, for personal reasons, must relinquish active status
- Life—member for 20 or more years who has rendered outstanding community services and has applied for Life Membership status

Note please that LCI is waiving \$35 membership application fee through June 30, 2021 so this winter and spring are excellent opportunities to add new members to our clubs.

#### **Mid-Winter Convention Resolutions**

I hope you are planning on attending the 32 C convention in Florence this Month, either in person or virtually with a Zoom registration. We are planning on another "first"; that of having a "COVID Safe Convention" and holding a spectacular Gala Awards Dinner at the new Florence Center on February 6<sup>th</sup>.

The mid-winter convention marks the beginning of our second half of our fiscal year and is a time of reflection on the accomplishments of the first half and a time to make goals/" resolutions" for the second half. I would like to congratulate clubs in the district that either added new members or maintained a net zero membership gain so far this year (39 out of 61 clubs or 64%). We have also found ways to provide service to the needy in our communities. However, service reporting can still use some improvement. Only 35 out of 61 clubs reported service or 57%. So, our 1<sup>st</sup> **RESOLUTION** is to improve service reporting by 18+% so that we end the fiscal year with 75+% of our clubs reporting service.

Our 2<sup>nd</sup> **RESOLUTION** is to improve the attendance at each and every club in the district. I know that some club presidents have said that the low attendance can be attributed to the District Governor visits at their meetings but I believe there may be other underlying reasons. The first of these is the amount of negative press and fear that the media has generated over the pandemic. Many Lions are unwilling to leave
