

# State Convention Service Panel Discussions REGISTER FOR YOUR CHOICE OF PANEL DISCUSSIONS

### WHEN REGISTERING FOR THE CONVENTION

Our April 9-11 MD 32 State Convention will offer something a bit different as breakout subjects.

Attendees will have the opportunity to participate in two sessions examining our five service focus areas. The first segment offering four panel discussions will begin Saturday at 9 AM and the second series at 10 AM. Clubs with multiple members attending may wish to divide up to cover all four sessions during the first and then repeat sessions of each.

#### **HUNGER**

PCC Eddie Marshall of our Joanna Lions Club, and Lions Wendy Luce (Winnsboro Lions) and Kathy Carroll (Seneca Lions) will lead the sessions each hour on **HUNGER** and service activities in that arena. PCC Eddie is an elementary school principal whose staff feeds over 350 students and faculty each school day. Lion Wendy is the director of the Fairfield Community Food Bank, and Lion Kathy is president of the Seneca Lions Club which received the LCIF grant last year for the big generator for the local food pantry.

#### VISION

Discussing **VISION** services will be Lions David Allen (River Hills/Lake Wylie) and Hope MacBride (Tega Cay) with DG Bill Hahn (Georgetown Lions). The three have been part of the Lions Vision Screening task force that has formulated a COVID protocol program and then pursued formal relations with school nurses throughout the state. Lions David and Hope are experienced screeners and have been instrumental in the task force's work as visualized and orchestrated by DG Bill.

#### THE ENVIRONMENT

PDG/Dr. Louis Drucker (Kingstree Lions), and Mr. Aldon Knight (Upstate Forever) will focus on **ENVIRONMENTAL** service opportunities from their experiences. PDG Louis has led the annual Black River Clean Up project for many years; Ms. Ringo is a community action officer; and Mr. Knight is a professional fundraiser for upstate environmental causes.

#### **CHILDHOOD CANCER and DIABETES**

Since we only have four breakout rooms for the time slots, the fourth sessions will cover two service focus areas, **CHILD-HOOD CANCER** and **DIABETES**. Lions Laura Sharpe-Waites (Mid Carolina Lions), Cynthia Harrison (Myrtle Beach Lions) and Dianne Corlew (Tennessee Lions) will be joined by Ms. Laura Allen of Spartanburg and will comprise the panel to lead us in examining these areas of service possibilities and existing programs. Lion Laura is an Advanced Certified Grief Specialist. Lion Cynthia is a retired nurse. Lion Dianne makes presentations on diabetes and their loss of a son to the disease. Ms. Allen is active with the Children's Cancer Partners of Spartanburg.

Panelists have been asked to explore service opportunities they have performed or are familiar with, and then audience members will have the chance to ask questions and talk BRIEFLY about their club's work in the focus area(s) under discussion. After these motivating sessions, participants should take away new ideas for service projects and inspiration to improve or expand existing service work.

"Lion Bobbie, our convention chair, asked me to put together appropriate breakout sessions for our state convention, and, as Global Service Team (GST) coordinator for our multiple district, I could not think of a more appropriate choice of subjects which to highlight than the five service areas Lions International has been emphasizing for the last several years," Lion Paul Dove said. "We have built four panels of Lions and other seasoned leaders in the five areas, and I believe the tough choice will be deciding which two panel discussions to attend."
