#### BOARD CHAIRMAN'S NOVEMBER NEWSLETTER GROWING THE CAMP MORE

December 1 is fast approaching. Anyone interested in running for office on the Camp's Board of Directors for 2023-2024 needs to have their letter of intent signed by your Club secretary and sent to our Immediate past Board Chairman Lion Ed Ressler by December 1. The Office Positions that must be elected each year are: Board Chairman, Vice Chair, Secretary and Treasurer. The end of June I will have completed my limit of two consecutive terms; so a new Chairman has to be elected.

At the District Conventions in 2023 Districts 18-I and 18-O will be electing District Directors. All letters of intent to run for District Director must be submitted to their District Governor and the Secretary of the Camp's Board at least 30 days before their District Convention. District 18-I convention is on March 11, 2023 and District 18-O convention is on April 1, 2023

Camp Director Mike Williams is busy getting applications and putting this year's Christmas Camp program together. He is in need of volunteers to help with the program. Please call him at 912-283-4320 if you can help. The dates for the Christmas Session are December 9-11.

The Board of Directors met for its Fall Meeting on October 22 in Perry, GA. There was a lot of discussion on the needs of the Camp. Per the Camp's Constitution the Board approved the 2023 Calendar Year Operating Budget for \$446,366. Some of the major increases are due to:

- Cost of goods
- Increase in number of Campers
- Cost of a Grant writer
- Hiring a part time B&G maintenance employee
- Over all maintenance due to aging equipment
- Increase cost and new fundraising projects

Camp Director Mike Williams and I attended GVEST (Georgia Vision Educators Statewide) in Macon on October 12-13. We had a chance to talk to a lot of TVI's (Teachers of Vision Impaired). Some of whom were new and were not aware of our Camp. Others were aware of our Camp and were willing to encourage their students to attend our Camping Sessions. We also talked to some of the TVI's about helping with our Summer and Christmas Sessions.

On November 4th and 5th the Long Range Planning Committee held a Strategy Planning retreat at the Camp. Thirty people had signed up and 25 attended. The Board of Directors and every Standing Committee were well represented. Both full time employees, Mike and Gail Williams, attended. Previous Camper and Counselor Michael Brown and his wife attended. Georgia Blind Lions President Ron Worley and his wife were coming but had to cancel at the last minute due to illness. There was a good cross section of Lions that were very experienced with the Camp and Lions that were relatively new to the Camp. A lot of new ideas and suggestion came out of the Retreat. The entire session was well lead by 2VDG Larry Griggers, chairman of the Long Range Planning Committee. The purpose of the Retreat was to come up with Action Items that are needed to meet the six Goals previously approved by the Board of Directors. All the Action Items will be reviewed by the Long Range Planning Committee and then presented to the Board of Directors for approval. The group agreed that this type of Strategy Retreat should be held each year and if possible before the approval of the Camp's budget for the following year.

Congratulations to 18-I for again having the highest percentages (75%) of their Clubs making contributions to the Camp and congratulations to 18-N for making the most contributions to the Camp of \$44,877 year-to-date.

#### Camp Finances Y-T-D thru OCTOBER 31, 2022

We are now 10 Months of the 2022 Fiscal Year -- the end of the year is not far away. We only have about 6 weeks left to make this a successful financial year -- and we have a long way to go. Christmas Camp is coming soon -- and we know many Campers are looking foreward to another trip to Camp, they always do.

Looking forward -- we have a new fiscal year starting January 1, 2023. We are looking forward to the challenges of 2023. We are planning to increase our number of Campers in Summer Camp and also in Christmas Camp during 2023. Plans are underway to make this new year the best yet. Of course, providing more services to more Campers means we will need more funding to make things happen. Our Board has just approved a very agressive budget to make things happen for our Campers. Our 2023 Budget will need support from Lions Clubs and Individual Lions from every locality in Georgia. Please consider how you can help our Camp financially -- now and in 2023.

Our current Cash Liquidity remained at just under 1.0 months of normal monthly expenses for the month of OCTOBER. We are still in a 'Cash Rebuilding Stage' -- we need to replinish our cash. We need everyone's help to do so. Contributions -- from Clubs or individuals -- are needed now. This is the time to build our Cash. Please Help -- NOW.

There are numerous ways to make your contribution -- and your Club will receive credit at the same time. Our Fundraising Committee is working hard to do their part, please support them in their effort.

The Camp, and, therefore, the Campers, benefit tremendously when the Camp is in a healthy financial position.

#### Needs List 2023: updated 11/10/22 Many have asked what does the camp need?

The following items will help the daily maintenance and other operations of the camp.

- 1. Gallon size bleach- Five cases of 6 bottles per case
- 2. Toilet bowl cleaner- 2 cases of 12? bottles per case
- 3. Lysol dis-infectant spray- 2 cases of 6? cans per case
- 4. Spray cans of room deodorizer- 20 cans of spray
- 5. Laundry detergent- gallon size preferable- 3 cases of 6? Bottles per case
- 6. Dish detergent (dawn preferred)-Large size- 20 bottles needed
- 7. Windex window cleaner- 2 cases of 6 per case
- 8. Clorox disinfectant spray bottles -2 cases of 6 per case-(32 oz.)
- 9. Dish towels for the kitchen
- 10. Toilet Tissue any brand
- 11. Paper towels any brand 4 cases
- 12. 60-gallon industrial size garbage bags
- 13. 13-gallon trash bags
- 14. Bug spray- non- DEET and DEET accepted. -20 cans spray or pump
- 15. Disposable ponchos for rainy days 50 these can be found at dollar stores or dollar general
- 16. Small first aid kits- 24 sets of travel size
- 17. Wasp Spray- Black Flag brand preferred. 2 cases of 12 per case.
- 18. Ant poison- here at the camp we have ant issues, we need your help- bags of poison or industrial strength liquid needed. You can never ask for enough of this. All donations appreciated.
- 19. 50-1 mix for weed eaters and lawn maintenance tools used here at the camp. 24 bottles
- 20. 5W30 motor oil- 1 case of 12 qts. Per case
- 21. 10W30 motor oil- 1 case of 12 qts per case
- 22. 1 five gallon bucket of Hydraulic Fluid for the tractor

- 1. Weed pulling, edging, raking, wheel barrow use, and sanitation are many other jobs to be done during this work session. BRING your gloves and definitely some BUG SPRAY!!
- 2. Repair the Whale Watch element at the Low Ropes Course
- 3. Wooden picnic tables need replacing. This task has been COMPLETED!
- 4. Nature Trail –build up low lying areas we continue to need Two loads of crushed asphalt and Two loads of fill dirt.
- 5. Paint water heater room located behind the newly renovated Staff Building.
- 6. Paint the Water Tank
- 7. Paint the pump house at the pond
- 8. Paint sidewalks at the exit doors to the bunkhouse.
- 9. Repair Emergency exit door at restrooms in the Dining Hall.
- 10. Clean and paint swing frames at the fire pit area.
- 11. Railing and post need repair at the back double door entrance to the dining hall
- 12. Sitting Swings at the fire pit need to be cleaned and painted.
- 13. Activity Site Warning signs have been replaced and repaired but framing needs cleaning and painting.
- 14. Repaint Dining Hall.
- 15. Lights in Large Dormitory and Bunkhouse Dormitory still need to be converted to LED bulbs.
- 16. Pull out canoes and see which ones need repairing
- 17. Repair broken board on canoe cart
- 18. Tin roof over bleachers at horse arena needs to be re-applied
- 19. Pressure wash poolside deck- (This will now have to be done next spring)
- 20. Pressure Wash all buildings
- 21. Fence repair (several post and rails have decayed and broken)
- 22. Fence is leaning at rental house needs to be secured properly
- 23. Low hanging limbs over the road that access' RVs to the back of the camp need trimming. Man-lift, chain saws will be needed
- 24. Playground needs limbs of tree trimmed to adult head height.
- 25. All cabinets in the main dorm need to be checked for easy opening and closing-repair those that need repairing
- 26. Need some shower heads replaced in the main dormitory
- 27. Climbing Wall due for pressure washing and wood treatment (Man lift will need to be rented to accomplish this task) Other minor maintenance can be done during this activity) **Climbing Wall has some** structural damage that must be repaired before camp season 2023. This work will have to be done by a professional contractor.
