Fellow 18-I Lions,

**Merry Christmas and Happy Holidays to one and all!** I hope this season brings you pleasant memories and goodwill as you serve.

I was honored to participate in the Covington Lions Club Christmas Parade on December 3rd. It was VERY well-planned and attended and looked like everyone had A LOT of fun! If you haven't been, please make plans to go next year!

We are already at the midpoint of our Lions year! Tempus Fugit! YES, time really does fly! This is a good time for us to assess where we are and how we are doing with our goals in our clubs and the district. In next month's newsletter, I will provide a detailed breakdown of Membership, Service, Leadership, and other areas in our District. I also ask that your club conduct a Club and Community Needs Assessment. You can find more information and the forms on the LCI website. Our goal is to work with you to formulate a plan tailored to your club to increase your membership AND service using the new GMA (Global Membership Approach) as you: Build a Team, Build a Vision, Build a Plan, and Build Success, to strengthen your club.

If your club doesn't have a Zone Chair, 1st VDG Chris, 2nd VDG Rita, and I will be working with you. Please contact one of us to get more information. In addition, we will be presenting this entire program to the District on March 11 in Winder (3rd Cabinet Meeting/District Convention) so I am encouraging every club to make plans to attend this important presentation.

I have an ample supply of the brand-new MD18 Lions Brochures. The committee did an excellent job with the design, and these brochures can be a useful tool for your club. If you would like some for your club, make sure to be at the 3rd Cabinet Meeting/District Convention on March 11th in Winder and we'll get them to you.

Speaking of that, we are planning a number of events for that day, including the elections of 2nd, VDG, 1st VDG, and DG for Lion year 2023-2024. Please make sure that your club is in good standing and that your Delegates have been submitted before the deadline. We will have much more detailed information sent to you soon.

We have excellent Committee Chairs this year who would LOVE to come to your club to present a program on their area of Lionism! Please go through the District Directory and reach out to them to learn more about our 5 Initiatives, plus LCIF, Lighthouse, Camp, and more!

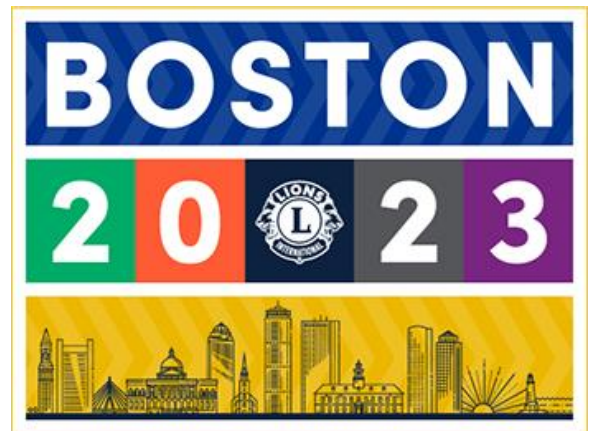

## **Georgia Lions Camp List of Needs**

Many have asked what does the camp need? The following items will help the daily maintenance and other operations of the camp.

- Gallon size bleach – five cases of 6 bottles per case
- Toilet bowl cleaner – 2 cases of 12 bottles per case
- Lysol disinfectant spray – 2 cases of 6 cans per case
- Spray cans of room deodorizer – 20 cans of spray
- Laundry detergent – gallon size preferable- 3 cases of 6 bottles per case
- Dish detergent (dawn preferred) – Large size – 20 bottles needed
- Windex window cleaner – 2 cases of 6 per case
- Clorox disinfectant spray bottles – 2 cases of 6 per case (32 oz.)
- Dish towels for the kitchen
- Toilet Tissue – any brand
- Paper towels – any brand - 4 cases
- 60-gallon industrial size garbage bags
- 13-gallon trash bags
- Bug spray – non-DEET and DEET accepted – 20 cans spray or pump
- Disposable ponchos for rainy days – 50 – these can be found at dollar stores or dollar general
- Small first aid kits – 24 sets of travel size
- Wasp Spray – Black Flag brand preferred – 2 cases of 12 per case
- Ant poison – bags of poison or industrial-strength liquid needed.
- 50-1 mix for weed eaters and lawn maintenance tools – 24 bottles
- 5W30 motor oil – 1 case of 12 qts per case
- 10W30 motor oil – 1 case of 12 qts per case
- 1 five gallon bucket of Hydraulic Fluid for the tractor

Part I includes 5 activities which are mandatory and Part II lists 28 activities in which a Lion may choose to participate. To qualify, a Lion must complete all 5 mandatory activities in Part I, and complete 11 or more of the 28 options in Part II.
