Is Your Lions Club Reporting in MyLion?

With 29 of the 56 Lions Clubs in District 18-I reporting activities on LCI’s MyLion website, it appears that 127,521 persons have been served since July 1st (See below). Unfortunately, the numbers shown in the chart below are most likely lower than the true numbers.

As of this writing, 52% of our district’s clubs have reported their service projects and fundraising activities. While the percentage has increased, we are still well short of District Governor Steve Helwig’s goal of having at least 75% of district clubs report.

Lions ALERT – Safety Tips for Winter Months

It's starting to get cold, and winter is not far away. Did you know half of home heating fires are reported during the months of December, January, and February?

There is something about the winter months and curling up with a good book by the fireplace, but did you know that heating equipment is one of the leading causes of home fire deaths?

With a few simple safety tips and precautions, you can prevent most heating fires from happening. Stay warm and safe this winter!

- Keep anything that can burn at least three feet (one meter) away from heating equipment, like the furnace, fireplace, wood stove, or portable space heater.
- Have a three foot (one meter) “kid-free zone” around open fires and space heaters.
- Never use your oven to heat your home.
- Have a qualified professional install stationary space heating equipment, water heaters, or central heating equipment according to the local codes and manufacturer’s instructions.
- Have heating equipment and chimneys cleaned and inspected every year by a qualified professional.
- Remember to turn portable heaters off when leaving the room or going to bed.
- Always use the right kind of fuel, specified by the manufacturer, for fuel burning space heaters.
- Make sure the fireplace has a sturdy screen to stop sparks from flying into the room.

- Ashes should be cool before putting them in a metal container. Keep the container a safe distance away from your home.
- Test smoke alarms at least once a month.

Heating Equipment Smarts

Install wood burning stoves following manufacturer’s instructions or have a professional do the installation. All fuel-burning equipment should be vented to the outside to avoid carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning.

Install and maintain CO alarms to avoid the risk of CO poisoning. If you **smell** gas in your gas heater, do not light the appliance. Leave the home immediately and call your local fire department or gas company.



Lions: Achieve the Order of the Golden Chain

Lions of District 18-I: Your District Governor, Steve Helwig, wants to see as many of our Lions as possible apply to become members of the Order of the Golden Chain this year.

Lions who achieve this honor take the first step toward being better Lions and better leaders. This achievement helps grow our clubs and brings more recognition to Lionism.

Club Marketing Chairs/Presidents/Secretaries should be sure that they publicize any club members who attain this honor. This honor is one of the highest a Georgia Lion can receive.

Eligibility: Every Lion who completes the requirements between May 1st and April 30th of the current Lion Year may be awarded the Order of the Golden Chain, each year he or she meets the qualifications required. *One award per Lion per year.*

Requirements: The Order of the Golden Chain contains two equally important parts. Part I includes five activities that are mandatory. Part II lists 28 activities in which a Lion may choose to participate. To qualify, a Lion must complete all five mandatory activities in Part I, and complete 11 or more of the 28 options in Part II.

Here are the five Mandatory Requirements: Attend a minimum of 75% of regular club meetings during the award period. (Missed meetings may be made up by attendance at a local board of directors meeting, District meeting, or a meeting of another Lions Club.); Attend a Club Board of Directors meeting; Attend a Zone or Cabinet meeting; Be an active Club committee member; Sponsor a new member and help them become an active member.

The Global Membership Approach combines a strategic approach and a set of resources for district teams to utilize to develop membership by: Rejuvenating districts with new clubs; Revitalizing clubs with new members; Re-motivating existing members with fellowship and exciting service; Providing training and support to our Lion Leaders. The approach has universal applicability, with the ability to customize based on regional needs and circumstances.

Why is the Global Membership Approach important?

Evidence of membership declines resonates with Lions worldwide. This process can revitalize membership growth to add more active hands in support of our core mission to meet humanitarian needs and be the global leader in impactful service.

How does the Global Membership Approach fit in with the 2022-2023 District Goals?

Established membership development goals focus on three data points: new members, new club development, and member retention. Through this process, districts, along with their zones, will be able to conduct a strategic analysis of the needs of their district, set realistic membership targets, and build plans to ensure a successful year. Although the Global Membership Approach is focused on membership development, the approach can also be applied to support the three other district goals focus areas: Leadership Development, Service, and LCIF support.
