## ***Don't Forget to Apply – Order of the Golden Chain***

Every active Lion should strive to achieve this prestigious honor. It is not too late to complete the requirements for the 2022-2023 Lions year. If you have already sponsored a new member in your club, you are well on your way to achieving the Order of the Golden Chain. Please review the award application, which is available on the Lions of Georgia website at [www.georgialions.org](http://www.georgialions.org), to see how many of the requirements you have already accomplished. The deadline to turn in your applications is April 30, 2023.

**Eligibility:** Every Lion who completes the Golden Chain requirements, between May 1st and April 30th of the current Lion Year, may be awarded the Order of the Golden Chain.

**Requirements:** The Order of the Golden Chain contains two equally important parts. Part I includes 5 activities that are mandatory including sponsoring a new member and part II lists 28 optional activities in which a Lion may choose to participate including serving as a Club Officer or Director. Eleven or more of these activities are required to qualify.

## ***Camilla Lions Club Members Serve with a F.O.C.U.S.*** (by Christy Wray)

The Camilla Lions Club has been actively serving the communities within Mitchell and Baker Counties for 70 years. Founded in 1952, the club has consistently focused their volunteer efforts over the years on local eyesight projects, such as: vision screenings, eyeglass collections, and eyeglass purchases for those in need. For the past five years, the work of the club has expanded into other service areas. Under the leadership of President Christy Wray and Vice-President Derek Hadley, the Camilla Lions Club now focuses their efforts on providing service opportunities for all five of the global causes supported by Lions Clubs International – Vision, Environment, Childhood Cancer, Hunger Relief, and Diabetes.

Camilla Lions Club members are now serving with a F.O.C.U.S. – “Finding Opportunities within Communities and United in Service”. During the month of October, the club kicked off the F.O.C.U.S. campaign with recognition of Blindness Awareness Month. The Lions Club members volunteered their time in four different schools to administer vision screenings to all 3rd and 4th grade elementary students. Members successfully screened 372 students and provided contact information for follow-up referrals. Following this successful vision screening campaign, the club was asked to provide a program at the Senior Citizen Center of Mitchell County where 20 seniors were screened and Lions club information was shared.

To support childhood cancer efforts, a challenge was issued to all club members and community members to support Joshua’s Block Party/LEGO Challenge during September which is Childhood Cancer Awareness Month. The project exceeded expectations and over 75 LEGO kits (approx. \$1000 value) were donated. The kits were delivered to regional organizers for distribution to local hospitals and children undergoing cancer treatments. (See photo on next page)

As a way of celebrating the Environmental cause, the club purchased and utilized five Peace Poster kits from Lions Clubs International. Over 60 middle school students participated in this program to support environmental efforts and to “Lead with Compassion” toward a peaceful future on our planet. The club held a luncheon for the five student winners, their family members, and school representatives. The students were awarded gifts and certificates for their accomplishments. Food bank donations and collections during November and December support the work of hunger relief in our area. Between November 1st and December 20th, Camilla Lions Club members will work with Mitchell County High School LEO Club students to collect canned goods and grits. In December, the LEO Club students will deliver the donations to the Mitchell County Food Bank.

In addition to the global cause of vision, In October, Lions Club members focused their efforts on education in the schools in honor of U.S. Constitution Day. Camilla Lions Club members and Georgia House of Representatives elected official, Joe Campbell, traveled to four local high schools and presented programs on the history of the U.S. Constitution, constitutional amendments, civic responsibility, and the importance of voting. Lion Representative Campbell shared the program and distributed pocket-size copies of the US Constitution, to over 250 high school students.

Lions Club International Foundation states, “Our mission is to empower Lions Clubs, volunteers, and partners to improve health and well-being, strengthen communities, and support those in need through humanitarian services and grants that impact lives globally, and encourage peace and international understanding.”

The Camilla Lions Club members’ F.O.C.U.S. work encompasses service in all areas of our community and for all age groups. The F.O.C.U.S. campaign, held from September – December, strives to serve the needs of our community while focusing on work within our schools. The targeted work completed during our F.O.C.U.S. campaign is only a glimpse into the servants’ hearts of our Camilla Lions Club members.

## Lions ALERT – Heating Safety

There is something about the winter months and curling up with a good book by the fireplace. But did you know that heating equipment is one of the leading causes of home fire deaths? With a few simple safety tips and precautions, you can prevent most hearing fires from happening.

### BE WARM AND SAFE THIS WINTER!

- Keep anything that can burn at least three feet away from heating equipment, like the furnace, fireplace, wood stove, or portable space heater.
- Have a three-foot "kid-free zone" around open fires and space heaters.
- Never use your oven to heat your home.
- Have a qualified professional install stationary space heating equipment, water heaters or central heating equipment according to the local codes and manufacturer's instructions.
- Have heating equipment and chimneys cleaned and inspected every year by a qualified professional.
- Remember to turn portable heaters off when leaving the room or going to bed.
- Always use the right kind of fuel, specified by the manufacturer, for fuel burning space heaters.
- Make sure the fireplace has a sturdy screen to stop sparks from flying into the room. Ashes should be cool before putting them in a metal container. Keep the container a safe distance from your home.
- Test smoke alarms at least once a month.

### FACT

Half of home heating fires are reported during the months of December, January, and February.

**Heating Equipment Smarts** ~ Install wood burning stoves following manufacturer's instructions or have a professional do the installation. All fuel-burning equipment should be vented to the outside to avoid carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning. Install and maintain CO alarms to avoid the risk of CO poisoning. If you smell gas in your gas heater, do not light the appliance. Leave the home immediately and call your local fire department or gas company.
