Leon the Lion (aka Jim Purton, charter member of the Greater Falls Run Lions Club in Stafford County, Virginia) grabs a pic with Canine Companions puppy Bogey at DogFest in Washington DC 2021. Purton headed the Lions' fundraising team—named in honor of his late wife, Michelle—that came in second place with a total of \$10,672. The return of the annual event to in-person after a virtual version in 2020 was welcome to canine & human participants alike.

Lions have been working with Leader Dogs for the Blind for a long time. Year after year, Lions clubs around the world, as well as our own club, support Guide Dogs. Nearly 60 clubs donated \$70,000 to Guide Dogs in the last two years. Lions also cook and serve food at events on campus,

and some Lions are puppy raisers for Guide Dogs. A great ongoing Lions project!

 - Donated \$50 to GA Lions Lighthouse in memory of Calvin Haney's mother.


