The bunnies come in two different sizes. Milk Chocolate & Dark Chocolate are 175g, and Clubs pay \$115/case of 24. The Milk, Dark, and White Chocolate also come in a 100g size, selling at \$90/case of 24. Unfortunately, the supplier probably won't be making the "no sugar added" this year, but if so, the 100g sizes are \$90/case of 24. *Prices include the freight & delivery fee ~ if you're not off the beaten track and have ordered more than 15 cases. Lions Clubs set the price they sell the bunnies for themselves.*

The Carlyle District Lions Club hosted the Provincial Lions Curling Bonspiel at the Carlyle Curling Club on the weekend of November 21st to 23rd. Eight teams participated in the event representing Alida and District, Bienfait, Burstall District, Carlyle District, Carnduff District, Eston, and Wawota District Lions.

Games began on Friday afternoon followed by a banquet and two guest speakers. The first was Justine Kyle, a Grade 2 teacher in Carlyle, who spoke about using the Lions Quest Program. The second speaker was Chaelynn Stewart, a curler who spoke about her two-time journey to the Scotties – once when they were in the bubble during Covid and there were no fans, and a second time, this past year, when she played third Different for Nancy Martin.

Friday evening also included a trivia game and a pie auction, with pies donated by PDG Lion Dennis Feduk (the Pie Man). A total of \$590 was raised for the Dog Guides *Difference Campaign*.




Together, Lions across Canada have contributed \$189,851 to The Difference Campaign, unlocking \$100,000 in matching funds, 25 percent of which



In the meantime, our family wishes everyone a safe, fun and fulfilling Christmas season and a Happy New Year.









CLERC is the Canadian Lions Eyeglass Recycling Centre. It is located in Calgary, AB and is fully run by volunteers. The centre receives eyeglasses, which they then sanitize, inspect, and sort. They then package them for distribution throughout the world to people who otherwise would not have access to eyeglasses.
