Many of our Lions are aware of the disastrous fires we have had in the part of our district south of the border. Over 240,000 acres of pasture and crop land have burned all the way from Omak to Hwy. 2 down by Coulee City.

The biggest need that I was made aware of was for cattle feed (hay) and fencing. As this need doesn't qualify for and emergency disaster grant from LCIF, your cabinet voted to use \$5000 from our Alert fund to help the Mansfield Lions Club purchase feed and disperse it.

We are encouraging individuals to help out also.

Fires in District D

I am sure some of you know about all the terrific fires we have had south of the border around the 1st of September. The fire started near Omak Lake in the Omak area, burned down to Bridgeport, crossed the river to Douglas County and then burned to Hwy. 2 which runs between Seattle and Spokane. Almost 450,000 acres were burned. I have been in touch with the Mansfield Lions club and they are asking for help. Some homes were burned, but the people are being taken care of. The biggest need at this time is for livestock feed and fencing as everything was wiped out.

I contacted LCIF about an emergency grant, but they can only be used for people. There is a District & Club Community Impact Grant that is based on donations to LCIF and would amount to \$2728 but takes over 90 days to get and I was told it might cover these items but not sure till the application was sent in.

We now have over \$9000 in our ALERT account and we have had this money for quite a few years. I would think that we could use some of this money (\$4000 to \$5000) to help the farmers. We are talking livelihood for the livestock owners.

This information was presented to our Cabinet, who favorably voted to support us giving \$5,000 to this cause.

More Fire Update:

The B.C. Wildfire service has been assisting its American counter parts just across the Canada-U.S. border. with a large wildfire that broke out just south of the national border, providing air tanker drops since Sept. 8.

More than 200 firefighters and related personnel from British Columbia are heading to the U.S. to help battle extreme wildfires in Oregon. The B.C. firefighters will join up with other firefighters from across Canada who are heading down Friday to help the American crews Over 800 BC Wildfire Service personnel volunteered to go The firefighters are heading to Redmond, Ore. where they will be deployed as needed. An additional 200 personnel may be deployed in the coming days or weeks. The BC Wildfire Service personnel will stay within their own bubble while conducting their firefighting efforts, separately from American firefighters.



Apple Cranberry Walnut Salad

6 cups salad combination of baby spinach, and any "green" mix
1 red apple
1 green apple
1 c. walnuts (chopped)
1/3 c. crumbled feta cheese

1/3 c. dried cranberries

Dressing 1 c. apple juice

4 tbsp. apple cider vinegar

2 tbsp honey

1/2 tsp salt

1/4 tsp pepper

1/4 c. oil

Core and chop apples (thin slices or small chunks)

Toss greens, apples, walnuts, feta and cranberries together

Whisk together all dressing ingredients. Toss with salad immediately before serving.
