As Lions – We Serve. So during the wildfire we offered our services in any form to the Ministry of Forestry. After doing a bit of security we were asked if we knew of a service that took water bottles etc. - that's when we began 'Dumpster diving'. Throughout the weeks we recycled thousands of water bottles, pop cans, and juice boxes. We met fire workers from across Canada; Mexico; Australia and the States.

We learned some hilarious life lessons from the 'Newfies'. Heard logistical fire jargon, which was carefully explained to us, learned about different aspects of 'tackling a wildfire of this particular strain', it was one of a kind – nothing to compare it to.

The food workers offered breakfast and coffee, service workers brought water and snacks. We were on first name basis with the drivers of service vehicles – Septic; garbage disposal; fuel; food, water and supplies. Got a shower every day from the water truck keeping the dust down.

Methinks some of the Lads and Lasses that stopped and chatted were lonely, they made a point of stopping every day of their 14 or 28 day stint.

The Service workers and Logistics kept the camp on an even keel from broken down generators to no eggs. They made sure there was always toothpicks and toilet paper.

It was a very tiring and interesting summer. We were proud to serve.

We give a heartfelt thank-you to all the men and women who worked so hard to keep our town safe. An awful summer of heat and smoke but we are all safe thanks to so many wonderful people. Yes, they were just doing their job, but what a job!

Imagine working in heavy work gear, in the smoke and heat and coming home to a tent.
