[The Regional Lions Leadership Institute [RLLI] is a leadership development program for Lions who want to get more deeply involved in Lionism—and an opportunity to meet other Lions throughout the region (MD5M). Attending this program will prepare your for future leadership and to gain a deeper understanding of how to serve Lionism for the future RLLI is beneficial in every facet of your life and not just in your role as a Lion—graduates over many years attest to this.]

We are looking for Lions from your district to attend the 2021 MD5M Regional Lions Leadership Institute! Lions that are selected as participants in the Institute must be in good standing in a Lions Club and may not be a 1st Vice District Governor, District Governor, Past District Governor, International Director, or Past International Director. The \$150 fee for the Leadership Institute includes the cost of materials, facility, staff, and four (4) meals. Room costs and additional meals are not included. However, a \$75 rebate from MD5M, through a grant from LCI, will be given to each participant that completes the program. Participants MUST be available to attend ALL sessions beginning on Thursday evening and ending Sunday afternoon.

Each district has the opportunity to send six (6) participants; however, if other districts do not meet their allotment, your district may send additional Lions. The Institute will have a maximum of 72 participants.

Applications are available from your District Governor or on the MD5M Website and are due (without fees) by August 31, 2021. Your District Governor will then make the final participant selection. Institute graduates from your district will tell you that the Regional Lions Leadership Institute is beneficial for you in every facet of your life and not just in your role as a Lion.

Through serving two tours in Vietnam, establishing a family, continuing to work, and finally retiring, Gary has been dedicated to keeping others safe. However, after a rapid decline in his ability to hear, he realized he would need help to remain aware of important sounds around him. At night when he takes them out,

he's nearly deaf.

Growing up in a loud work environment, followed by artillery noise levels in the military, likely caused progressive hearing loss throughout Gary's life. He felt his family's safety slipping out of his control. He was especially anxious at night when his wife, Deb, was left entirely in charge of the household's security. He would not be able to hear intruders or any of the smoke alarms in the home to notify others.

Gary says the wait for the right match was challenging but justifiable since, "A quality place takes their time to ensure that everything is in line." That insight and patience was reinforced the day he was partnered with Marly, a 2-year-old Labrador Retriever. Marly has transformed Gary's world by bringing his attention to noises he can't hear, then literally bringing him to the source of the sound. She alerts and shows him to the doorbell, the smoke alarm, a timer on his phone, and even Deb calling his name. One day his grandchild called for him downstairs and Marly alerted Gary to the request a floor away from them. He comments she is always alert and listening, ready to work even when she's not constantly needed.


