Plans are underway for the spring training sessions. I want to see representatives from all clubs in attendance. You are the future of Lions in your community – make sure you are armed for success.





Joe Schmit is an award-winning broadcaster, community leader, author, and popular keynote speaker. He is a long-time youth mentor committed to advocating for several community organizations and has contributed time to many other charitable organizations including Big Brothers and Big Sisters, Juvenile Diabetes Research Fund, The Mind over Matter Foundation. VEAP, and the Fairway Foundation. Joe is also

an author of three books: "Silent Impact, "The Impact Blueprint" and "The Right Thing To Do," a children's book about Minnesota Twins Hall of Famer Joe Mauer.



Katie Shatusky is the Executive Director and Co-Founder of Thumbs Up, a nonprofit organization dedicated to helping others and uplifting the community. In 2014, she co-founded Thumbs Up in honor of her late grandfather, Bob Schmit, who died by suicide in 2010. Katie is also the author and illustrator of the children's book, The Ladybug Hug. One of her most profound experiences was donating a kidney to a complete

stranger in October 2020, exemplifying her commitment to making a difference in the lives of others.



PDG Daniel Marney Elkins is a professional drug prevention specialist and is the executive director of the Bellevue Community Center. He specializes in creating youth leadership programming by teaching strategic thinking and service learning. PDG Daniel is one of the founders of the Lions Virtual movement and has presented at several

International Conventions, USA/Canada Forums, Europa Forums, Anzi Forums, ISAME Forums and at district conventions around the world. He was appointed to the Lions' International Board of Directors in 2023 by Dr. Patti Hill. PDG Daniel has also served as a new club development consultant for Lions Clubs International.



PCC BJ Blahnik is originally from Seymour, Wisconsin, is the youngest of five children and was raised around farming. He was diagnosed with Retinitis Pigmentosa (RP) at about the age of ten. After his retirement due to his diminished vision, PCC BJ and his wife Victoria opened in 2017 their own business, Reach Forward, which works with special needs individuals through day services and a residential program. In 2006 PCC BJ's life

changed forever when he received his first Leader Dog. In October of 2022, he returned for his current Leader Dog, Jackson, a male Yellow Lab. Prior to Jackson's formal training in Rochester Hills, MI, he was raised by traditional puppy raisers in SE Michigan. Leader Dog Jackson is PCC BJ's fifth Leader Dog, so he is calling him Jackson 5.



IP Fabricio Oliveira is a member of the Catolé do Rocha Lions Club since 1985 and has held several offices in the association. In recognition of his service as a Lion and to the association, he has received many awards including multiple International Presidents' Certificates of Appreciation, Leadership Medals, Presidential Medals, and the Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honor awarded by the association to its members. International President Fabricio and his wife.

Amariles, also a member of the Catolé do Rocha Lions Club and a Melvin Jones Fellow, have two daughters, a son, and a granddaughter. International President Fabricio's theme for this year is *Make Your Mark*. The IP believes there is a leader inside every Lion and all leaders know that, through collective action and individual commitment, we can inspire and empower whole communities.





2025 MINNESOTA STATE

Hello Fellow Lions and LEOs! Your state fair coordinator, Lion Karen J Strong, here reaching out early to all 5M7 clubs. State fair will be at our door before we know it. I want to provide some new information and a calendar so you can plan ahead! State Fair is a wonderful opportunity to earn money for your club. Don't miss your chance!!! Your volunteering efforts will gain you not only \$\$\$s, but also free parking, and free access into the fair.

2025 Minnesota State Fair Dates: Aug. 21 to Labor Day, Sept. 1

A few new processes will be implemented in 2025. There will be two phases for accepting volunteers: club holds and open scheduling.

You will not receive mailed passes for shifts without a named volunteer. I will coordinate with clubs directly for passes needed after the mail date.

No outside groups or individuals will be contacted unless there are significant open shifts left to fill on August 1st and are not guaranteed. Clubs will have priority consideration on any open shifts not assigned to clubs.
