I hope this message finds you warm and healthy. With the current frigid temperatures and various illnesses circulating, we need to take every precaution to stay safe and healthy.

I've had the pleasure of attending many of the district midwinter conventions recently. These events have been enriching, featuring excellent speakers, and the opportunity to connect with several International Directors and fellow Lions from our multiple district. On February 10th I traveled to the Q Center in St. Charles, Illinois for District

Governors training. I've been very lucky that I've stayed healthy during my travels. Fingers crossed my luck continues!!!

The training at the Q Center was an incredible experience. Representatives from 91 countries, totaling over 750 1st Vice District Governors and District Governor-Elects, gathered, including our team from MD5M. The sessions, held from February 10-13, combined general assemblies and small group sessions. In the general sessions, all of us came together in a huge ballroom and were inspired by our International First Vice President, A.P. Singh and a number of our international leaders. My small group included members from India, Canada, Iceland, the United Kingdom and the USA, led by PID Sunil Kumar from India. It was a wonderful



opportunity to get to know our peers, explore new ideas, and be inspired by service perspectives from around the world.

A highlight of the training was an assignment involving a "passport." We were challenged to obtain signatures



from Lions from seven different countries, each sharing their global cause. In many cases I needed to use my Google translator app which helped me communicate with non-English- speaking Lions, enhancing the experience.

I was extremely impressed with our incoming International President, A.P. Singh. He is an exceptional speaker, teacher and motivator. One of his main topics was "Mission 1.5", emphasizing the need to increase our global membership to 1.5 million by July 1, 2027. The needs of individuals from across the world are immense. The only way we can fulfil these needs is with more helping hands. More members, more service. His mantra during our training was "Lead to Serve and Serve to Lead". Additionally, he shared that 1.5 million new members is a big number, but, if broken down by the number of clubs across the world it would mean that each club would need to bring in a net of 3 new members annually, making this an achievable goal. So many of your clubs are bringing in new members so I encourage you to continue what you are doing to grow your clubs. Service projects are one of the best ways to bring in new members. Together we will reach our goal.

Our MD5M convention is fast approaching. Our district is hosting this

year's convention and it's going to be awesome!!! We have incredible speakers including our International President, Fabricio Oliveira. You will learn a lot, meet incredible Lions from our multiple and have loads of fun. I encourage you to attend. Registration information is included in this issue of the Gram. TEAM SHEEHAN CHARITABLE FOUNDATION UPDATE

FEBRUARY 17,2025

The mission of the TEAM Sheehan Charitable Foundation (501c3) is to empower MD5M Lions Clubs to provide greater service by boosting their ability to complete community projects with matching grants.

Three grants were recently awarded:

\$3,000 went to the Dillworth Lions Club to help the local food shelf purchase food. The Jackson Lions Club is using the \$1,500 grant for the Snow Angels, who clear snow for the elderly.

The Pine Island Lions Club was awarded \$3,000 for maintenance on bathroom buildings and work on the park and trail system.

The Foundation relies on monetary donations to continue awarding matching grants. Pins are given for individual monetary donations of \$100 and medals for \$1,000 donations. Photos are below.
