



# Lions Building Ramps, Changing Lives

What does it take to build and install three handicap ramps in District 5M7? Approximately 10 Lions, 2 non-Lions, 295 hours of dedication, warm clothes for the Fall and Winter, and, most importantly, someone with the expertise to make it happen.

Over the past few months, several requests have come in for handicap ramps to help community members safely enter and exit their homes. The first request came from Linwood, a community without a Lions Club. When an email was sent out across the district, Immediate Past District Governor (IPDG) Peter Lendway took action. He reached out to Past District Governor (PDG) Mark Landwehr to figure out how the Lions of



5M7 could step in—securing funding, organizing volunteers, and ensuring the ramp was properly built.

With the motto "Where there is a need, there is a Lion," PDGs Mark and Peter assessed the site, purchased materials, and fabricated the ramp in PDG Mark's garage. With assistance from members of the Ham Lake, Cambridge and Rush City Lions Clubs, the ramp was transported and installed. Financial support for the project came from the Forest Lake, Wyoming, Chisago Lakes, and Cedar-East Bethel

Lions Clubs. The total time to complete this ramp was 96.5 hours, with 8 Lions and 1 non-Lion contributing their time and skills.

Shortly after the Linwood ramp was completed, Lion Dallas Jelmberg of

the Cedar-East Bethel Lions received a request from the Bethel community about another needed ramp. PDG Mark and Lion Ed Dols of the Ham Lake Lions quickly fabricated the ramp, which was then installed by members of the Cedar-East Bethel and Ham Lake Lions Clubs. Funding was secured from



the Ham Lake, Elk River, and Spring Lake Park Lions Clubs. This ramp took 101.5 hours to complete, with 9 Lions and 1 non-Lion working together to make it happen.

Before long, the Nowthen Lions Club received an email about another community member in need of a ramp. Having already been involved in two successful ramp builds, they knew exactly who to call—Lion Mark Landwehr. The Nowthen Lions Club purchased the materials, and PDG Mark, along with many of the same dedicated Lions from the previous projects, once again fabricated the ramp in his garage. Within a week, the ramp was assembled, providing safe

access to another grateful community member. This final project took 97 hours, with 8 Lions and 1 non-Lion lending a hand.

#### What do Lions do? We Serve!

Through teamwork, determination, and generosity, the Lions of District 5M7 have made a profound difference in the lives of those in need. These three ramps symbolize not only accessibility but also the strength of our Lions community coming together to serve.

# HAVING A KIDSIGHT VISION SCREENING IS SUCH A SIMPLE SERVICE PROJECT TO DO!

There are 51 clubs in District 5M7 and only 14 clubs have done KidSight screening events this year. However, those 14 clubs screened a total of 5,235 kids at 73 different events/schools. There was a total of 622 kids that were referred for evaluation by an eye care professional. This is approximately a 12% referral rate.

Imagine how many kids we could screen if we had more clubs involved. The foundation has made it our goal to get at least 50% involvement from each district. That means 5M7 needs to get 16

more clubs participating in screenings this year! If your club is interested in seeing what KidSight is all about, please reach out to us! Start out small...think pancake breakfast, fish fry, a community fair or business expo. We bring the equipment and everything you need. It isn't hard and we will be there to support you every step of the way!

# SIGHT SAVER AWARDS

Did you know that your club qualifies for a Sight Saver Award for every \$1,000 your club has donated. If you would like to know the status of how many awards you have available, contact Lion Deb. MD5M KidSight Foundation also has a Sight Saver Partner award. This award is given to businesses or people that have supported vision screenings. Cedar East Bethel surprised a district nurse this past fall with one of these awards. They have a wonderful partnership with her and because of that, they screen 3 elementary schools each year. In the past couple of years, they have screened a total of 2,992 kids in these schools.

- · There is a small stipend available to hosts to assist with the cost of hosting





# **Monticello Lions Kidsight Screening Event**

The Monticello Lions held a Kidsight screening event during their annual Holiday Pancake Breakfast on Dec. 8<sup>th</sup> at the Monticello American Legion. In addition to a heart breakfast of pancakes, eggs, sausage, ham, muffins, and beverages, kids were also treated to visits from the Grinch, the Muffin Man, and Santa, plus they received a toy from Santa's bag, and various goodies distributed by the Monticello Royalty. The Kidsight booth screened 23 kids and had one referral in a child who was not previously known to need glasses. We did also have one child with very dark brown eyes which the screening machine was unable focus on despite several of our best efforts. I bring this up just to let other clubs that are doing this, or thinking of doing this, that there is an occasional child that the machine just can't read, and that is expected. To be thorough, those children should be referred for a complete eye exam.

# **Monticello Lions Holiday Food Baskets Another Success!**

For over 40 years the Monticello Lions have distributed holiday food baskets to those in need in the Monticello School District. The project is advertised through the Help Center/Food shelf, schools, the Shopper newspaper, the Community Center and the Library, plus the Monticello Lions webpage and Facebook site.

A special thanks to Dahlheimer's for letting us use their space again to facilitate the project & thank you to our community for volunteering your time to put together the food baskets for families in need this holiday season! Clients have about 3 weeks to send in a form to be registered, and then come to pick up 2 boxes of groceries, this year on Dec. 7<sup>th</sup>. The Groceries are purchased from

of groceries, this year on Dec. 7<sup>th</sup>. The Groceries are purchased from Cub Foods which generously gets us the food at a discount (plus provides free donuts for the workers!). Cub loads the food pallets onto a truck donated by Dahlheimer's Distributing and it is transferred to their warehouse which they also donate for a day.





The Lions and Dahlheimer's staff arrange the food in 2 distribution lines. Boxes are assembled and numbered by volunteers and then teams of volunteers go down the

lines putting the proper number of each item into the boxes. The boxes are stacked by one of the delivery doors and as clients show up, volunteers carry their boxes to their vehicle. Clients unable to get to Dahl-

heimer's get their boxes delivered bv volunteers. Each basket (= 2 boxes) contains about \$100 worth of groceries including a Turkey. This year's project distributed 182 baskets. 34 of those were delivered to clients unable to come themselves. Funds for this project are raised from the Monticello Lions Brewfest celebration and donations to the Holiday Pancake Breakfast, so if you have the chance, please come out this year and support both of those fundraisers! This is a great project that brings together much of the Monticello community, and could not be done without everyone's help.



# HOLIDAY LIGHTS Recycle Project
