

dation. Our mission states, "The Minnesota Lions Diabetes Foundation, Inc. is dedicated to improving the quality of life for people with diabetes by funding research to cure diabetes, providing education and sponsoring preventive health activities."

This month I would like to share some **SERVICE PROJECTS** for diabetes that your club could very easily do. DG Peter is asking clubs to find a NEW project this year and this would be a great way to tell him, "We did it!" Here are some diabetes projects that could be easily executed by your club:

- Donate a diabetes magazine subscription or diabetesrelated books to your local library.
- Sponsor a child to attend a diabetes camp and/or supply a camp with needed supplies.
- Post monthly notices on your club website and social media, sharing available community resources for people with or at risk of diabetes.
- Organize a Strides: Lions for Diabetes Awareness event in your community.
- Develop a list of patient resources and services and distribute them to Lions and the public.
- Find a Diabetes educator to visit your local senior citizens group.
- Hand out the Diabetes Risk Assessment to the public at your club events.
- Ask all of your club members to take the Diabetes Risk Assessment

The above are very easy projects for diabetes to execute with your club in your community. Most people who have Type 2 diabetes do not know it and we can increase the Awareness!

Remember the Diabetes Pigs? Many years ago, each club had the opportunity to "get a piggy bank" from our diabetes chair. I know that some clubs still have those banks. Recently I brought a large piggy bank to a cabinet meeting and asked for donations of pocket change from our cabinet members. Our cabinet leaders put approximately \$20.00 worth of coins in the piggy bank that evening. We raised these funds for the MN Lions Diabetes Foundation in just a few minutes by passing the pig. Your club can do this! Let's dig out those piggy banks and bring them to each of our meetings asking for pocket change. It all adds up!

The goal of the **Affordable Hearing Aid Program** is to help individuals who have a hearing loss and limited financial resources. The hearing foundation helps them find hearing

aids at prices that are affordable to them, no matter how limited their financial resources may be.

The Minnesota Lions Hearing Foundation accomplishes this by collecting used hearing aids. These used hearing aids are then sold to hearing manufacturers who use them for their repair services. The funds generated, along with negotiated rates from manufacturers, audiologists, and hearing aid dispensers, are used to purchase hearing aids at greatly reduced prices. Your contribution of used hearing aids makes a significant difference in the lives of those who would simply slip through the cracks. The Lions International Trading Pin Club (LITPC) has announced for the 2023 – 2024 school year that there will be 4 US \$2,500 scholarships awarded. Graduating Leos OR graduating sons/daughters, grandsons/granddaughters of Lions are eligible to apply for the LITPC Youth Scholarship. The LITPC goal is to help our future leaders and give students a financial helping hand. This program started in 2012. Recipients have been from Connecticut (2), Delaware (2), Georgia, Iowa, Louisiana, Minnesota (4), New York (3), Ohio (4), Oklahoma (2), Pennsylvania (2) and Virginia (6). The 2024 recipients will be announced at the LITPC Annual Meeting in 2024.

To obtain the current LITPC Youth Scholarship information:

- 2. In the left column, click on LITPC Scholarship Forms.
- 3. Then click on LITPC Scholarship Information.
- 4. When that page comes up, click on Scholarship Application Form. Read and follow ALL directions. Be sure to fill out ALL the forms neatly and correctly which includes the 4 essay questions (in 350 words or less) and the question about scholarships that you have been offered along with submitting a certified copy of your high school transcript including activities. Plus you also need to attach recommendations from 2 persons (i.e. teacher, coach, clergy, employer, etc.) AND attach a recommendation letter from a Lions Club member indicating the name of the Club and state/province and country in which the Club is located. MN LIONS CHILDHOOD CANCER FOUNDATION

Hello fellow Lions and Leos of the great 5M7

I had a wonderful Thanksgiving with my family, I hope you all enjoyed yours as well. It's amazing how fast this year has gone by. They say the older you get the faster time flies. If that's true I'll probably still be eating Thanksgiving turkey leftovers on July 4th and loving it when I am 90.

I started playing senior softball twice a week. I still have the attitude of an eighteen year old which gets my 68 year old body in some tough spots. I usually hurt for two days after a game; lucky for me we only play two games a week. I don't dare complain to my wife, you know what she would tell me. "Quit playing so hard you old coot." I haven't always listened to good advice from her for 45 years, probably won't about playing ball either. Time to get serious.

I'm the chairperson for the **Mn Lions Childhood Cancer Foundation in the 5M7.** I suspect many of you have heard about this foundation but I'd like to share a few facts with you. First, the Mn Childhood Cancer Foundation is relatively new. Incorporated on August 12, 2019. We are a 501(c)3 charitable organization so we can accept donations from your charitable gambling contributions.

Our goal was to raise \$100,000 in the 2019-2020 Lions year to help fund programs and research for children with cancer at the University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital. That year we raised \$300,000. We are still contributing to them. Why is this important? Have you seen the commercials put out by St. Jude's? They do a wonderful job explaining why it's important to support cancer research hospitals. It makes me cry when I watch these commercials. What they don't let people know is that the majority of money they raise is not spent in Minnesota for childhood cancer. They don't treat any children that have cancer in Minnesota. One hundred percent of the money raised by the Lions Mn Childhood Cancer Foundation stays in Minnesota. In addition to the research we support we also give to Kamp K.A.C.E. (Kids Against Cancer Everywhere) which helps provide a camp experience for kids who have cancer and their siblings. We also fund a matching grant program that enables a family who has a child with cancer and gets \$500 from a Lions Club to receive an additional \$500 from our foundation, no questions asked.

Please support our Mn Lions Childhood Cancer Foundation at the **Parade of Green** at our upcoming Lions Mid-Winter Convention. We have a Believe Award that has been established to recognize Clubs and individuals who have donated \$1000 to this worthy cause.

Quartz Becomes Rock Star for Zack

Zack, who is in his late 20s, has always wanted a dog. His parents playfully tease him that he "took it a little too far by getting sick," though.

In late 2020, Zack developed drug-resistant epilepsy as a result of an infection. He was in a medically induced coma for five weeks and continues having outpatient treatment at Mayo Clinic. It was one of his occupational therapists there who suggested Zack apply for a Can Do Canine.

Trained as a Seizure Assist Dog, Quartz is providing more independence and freedom for Zack. On their very first day together, Zack took her for a walk, leaving his house by himself for the first time in years. "Yes! I get to take the dog for a walk," says Zack, excitedly, of the now frequent activity.

With Quartz by his side, Zack feels confident and secure. Prior to having her, he felt hampered by "not being able to do anything by myself without having fear of having a seizure out of nowhere." These days, if one occurs, Quartz can get a phone for him, help him recover faster by licking him, provide deep-pressure therapy, and find a person in the home who can offer assistance. "Just having her next to me to comfort me in a scary situation is really nice," admits Zack.

Quartz has a keen awareness of Zack's symptoms. When Zack feels an episode coming on, he might sit down, and Quartz seems to know instinctively that her service is needed. Even if she's keeping an eye on Zack from another room, she'll rush to his side and put her skills into action.

Learning all of the commands for Quartz was no small feat for Zack. His mom, Lu, explains, "As someone who has memory issues, he was particularly challenged by that." Quartz was patient with Zack through the training process, though, and reserved deploying one of her signature sighs. "She's very much a drama queen," Zack says of the dog whose small ears remind him of Dorito chips.

Though Zack won't be able to return to his career as a restaurant cook, his world is gradually expanding thanks to Quartz, and he hopes to have a job again in the future.

The volunteer job of raising assistance dogs like Quartz is something this family deeply commends. Lu shares, "The fact that people raise a puppy and then say, 'Okay, here you go' and are willing to give their time, love, and their energy ... it's just amazing to me."

So Zack, who always wanted a dog, now has not just any dog, but his own world-expanding dog, Quartz.

Apparently my request for clubs to send me pictures and info on their environmental project paid off! Coon Rapids Lions Club sent me an article along with pictures of their

Memorial Garden. I know there are others out there and I want to highlight them all! So don't be shy and send me what your club is doing for the environment in your park or your city. So which club will be the next one to be highlighted?

MEMORIAL GARDEN IN LIONS COON CREEK PARK COON RAPIDS by Lion Marcia Guthrie, Coord of Memorial Garden

Lions Coon Creek Park, 1664 119th Avenue NW, Coon Rapids, MN, was started with a short ceremony to commemorate the beginning of the park on November 1, 1986 and construction of the park began in 1987. It was done in 3 phases. The park opened in 1990.

In 1999, the Lions Memorial Garden was constructed. The garden is 40 feet by 80 feet. It is watered by an automatic sprinkling system. In the beginning, a land-scaping company did all the planting in the garden of both perennials and annuals and trees and maintained it for several years. Starting in 2008, several members of both the Coon Rapids Lions Club and Coon Rapids Lioness Club volunteered in the Memorial Garden for Spring clean-up and planting and mulching and then Fall clean-up.

Starting in 2012 and to the present, the City of Coon Rapids donates annuals for us to plant and also donates the mulch for us to use in the garden. In 2016, one of the sections of the garden was entirely run over with weeds. Two Coon Rapids Lions Club members hired and paid for a landscaping company to come in and dig up the whole area. The landscapers placed 3 boulders in that section and NEW perennial plants and grasses were planted (approximately 60)!!

In 2022, Coon Rapids Lions Club volunteers in 5 visits to the Memorial Garden volunteered a TOTAL of 60 ½ hours!! In 2023, Coon Rapids Lions Club volunteers in 4 visits to the Memorial Garden volunteered a TOTAL of 51 hours!! These times included time spent with Spring Cleanup, the planting of flowers, spreading of mulch and Fall cleanup!! Every time we work in the Memorial Garden, the volunteer form is filled out by me indicating that it is an Environment Cause and Service as the Project Type.

EVERYONE who comes to the Memorial Garden LOVES what we have done!! In fact, many families will spend time in the Garden sitting on the benches relaxing and enjoying the beauty of NATURE!! ENJOY the pictures that show just some of what is in our Lions Memorial Garden!!


BREAKFAST WITH SANTA


