We were there for 5 days and provided over 3,000 Guatemalans with eyeglasses. This experience was lifechanging. I'm eager to go back. Plans are now for a Mission trip in November, 2024. Funds received from the Parade of Green will help fund these missions and help purchase much needed equipment.

The second Foundation is the Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF), the main humanitarian arm of the Lions around the world. LCIF helps restore sight and prevent blindness by improving eye care, supports youth through Lions Quest and other projects, provides disaster relief both short and long-term assistance and humanitarian needs providing programs that improve health, fight measles and provides aid to the disabled and hearing impaired. Your club's support to these Foundations will be a blessing to so many people around the world.

I look forward to seeing you at the convention. If you're unable to attend, I hope to see you at your Governor's night. Just know how much your service is appreciated. Wishing you and yours the very best in the New Year and always.

Graduating Leos OR graduating sons/daughters, grandsons/ granddaughters of Lions are eligible to apply for the LITPC Youth Scholarship. The LITPC goal is to help our future leaders and give students a financial helping hand. This program started in 2012. Recipients have been from Connecticut (2), Delaware (2), Georgia, Iowa, Louisiana, Minnesota (4), New York (3), Ohio (4), Oklahoma (2), Pennsylvania (2) and Virginia (6). The 2024 recipients will be:announced at the LITPC Annual Meeting in 2024.

To obtain the current LITPC Youth Scholarship information:

- 1. Go to the LITPC website: www.litpc.org
- 2. In the left column, click on LITPC Scholarship Forms.
- 3. Then click on LITPC Scholarship Information.
- 4. When that page comes up, click on Scholarship Application Form. Read and follow ALL directions. Be sure to fill out ALL the forms neatly and correctly which includes the 4 essay questions (in 350 words or less) and the question about scholarships that you have been offered along with submitting a certified copy of your high school transcript including activities. Plus you also need to attach recommendations from 2 persons (i.e. teacher, coach, clergy, employer, etc.) AND attach a recommendation letter from a Lions Club member indicating the name of the Club and state/province and country in which the Club is located. 

Project New Hope is focused on two main things: helping veterans and their families deal with post-war life, and preventing veteran suicides.

Here are two success stories from Project New Hope:



*A married couple came to a retreat with divorce papers already drawn up. By the end of the weekend they had thrown the papers Into the fire.

*Sometime after attending a retreat, a veteran was having a particularly tough day. Long story short, he put down the gun and picked up the phone.

Project New Hope invites war-time veterans to bring their families or friends with so they can learn from each other what their experiences were during the war. Just as the family doesn't know what it's like being in a war zone, the veteran doesn't know what the family went through while there was a big hole in their lives.

There are structured events such as counseling, group sessions, and kids activities so that the adults can talk. Some of the best work is done in a casual setting around the bonfire at night when people really open up.

Once you have a box full or two of eyeglasses give PDG Terry Wold or PDG Steve a call and we'll make arrangements to pick them up.

The MN Lions Diabetes Foundation sincerely hopes that each of our clubs is considering a donation to our foundation during the Parade of Green at convention which takes

The MN Lions Diabetes Foundation (MLDF) began as a committee of folks, two from each district, who realized that diabetes was going to be an ongoing issue and in 1987 began to organize as one large committee instead of each district having their own initiatives.

In 2007 the Council of Governors approved the concept of having a diabetes foundation in MD5M. In 2008, this foundation was approved at the convention. In 2009, its 501c3 status was approved and charitable gambling donations were able to be donated to this foundation.

Over 15 years, the foundation has donated over \$2,150,000, from what it has received in financial contributions. We continue to fund research activities to cure diabetes, provide education and sponsor preventative health activities. We need your continued support.



GREETINGS FELLOW LIONS AND LEOS

HELEN KELLER SAID:

I am just as deaf as I am blind. The problems of deafness are deeper and more complex, if not more important, than those of blindness. Deafness is a much worse misfortune for it means the loss of the most vital stimulus — the sound of the voice that brings language, sets thoughts astir and keeps the intellectual company of man.

The Minnesota Lions Hearing Foundation was founded in 1973 to promote to the fullest extent the advance of research and programs concerned with hearing health and communication disorders.

At the Lions Children's Hearing Center a family can see up to six doctors in one setting. They are: Audiologists, Ear, Nose, & Throat Specialists, Neuropsychologists, Speech-Language Pathologists, Infectious Disease Specialists, Geneticists. We created the Lions Newborn Hearing Screening Program. This was an ambitious initiative designed to establish newborn screening, without state funding or mandate, in every birthing hospital in Minnesota

Minnesota Lions Hearing Foundation established the Lions Hearing Aid Loaner Bank, providing pediatric hearing aids free of charge to infants who are newly identified with hearing loss. The foundation also collects used hearing aids. These used hearing aids are then sold to hearing manufacturers who use them for their repair services. The funds generated, along with negotiated rates from manufacturers, audiologists, and hearing aid dispensers, are used to purchase hearing aids at greatly reduced pricas. Your contribution of used hearing aids makes a significant difference in the lives of those who would simply slip through the cracks. If you have someone in need who is interested in this program, you can contact your District Trustee. Please donate on your Parade of Green.

Camos, Respite, Programs, Travel

True Friends is a nonprofit organization providing life-changing experiences that enhance independence and self-esteem for children and adults with disabilities.

Well over a year ago, Travis and Kevin, both supervisors of M Health Fairview Ambulance Operations, were discussing having Facility Dogs as part of their EMT programs. Not quite ready to take on the challenge himself, Travis remembers telling Kevin something like, "You do that and we'll see what happens."

Kevin did, bringing Can Do Canine Clayton on board at his Forest Lake location in 2022. The effects were immediate. It was then, after seeing the positive interactions that Clayton was having that Travis thought, "I'm in!"

So, in Summer 2023, Travis introduced Facility Dog Ian to his co-workers at the St. Paul EMS station. Travis says, "It's so crazy how having a dog in the building just changes people's mood and mentality."

That ability to alter negative emotions is a big reason why Ian is in this role. This beautiful red-colored yellow Lab knows just how to take the load off others. Travis explains that when staff members are talking and reliving a difficult experience, "A hard discussion would be harder without Ian in the room. Every day, he does things that having him here for that moment was what got us to the next step."

Ian's skills are on display when out in the community too. He is at Travis's side during EMS presentations at elementary schools and gladly takes his place on the ambulance during "Show and Shares." Travis said that while at a park this past summer, "We had a line waiting to get in the ambulance the whole four hours because Ian was in it. He hammed it up."

This docile dog can easily tap into his strength for soothing. The team is assigned to provide medical support during events at Alliance Field. One time, a lost child was so upset that police officers were not able to get the child to communicate with them. "Bringing Ian into the picture allowed the child to be redirected and calm down," shares Travis.

Fully realizing the power of lan's presence, Travis's hope for the future is to "introduce more four-legged creatures to health care." Travis considers lan a "unique gift" and intends on doing "whatever we can do to pay it forward." Because now that he has seen what happens with a Facility Dog, he's all in!

Lions and Leos

After many years, my house is finally paid for! Wonderful news except the minute I received the papers saying the house is

'free and clear', one by one my appliances, which served me so well, started to fail me. So with much determination, I decided to start looking at not only upgrading appliances but more energy efficient appliances. I set out to start investigating my options.

First on my list is my water heater which is probably 16 years old. Water heaters are a surprisingly big buzzkill. In fact, the seemingly simple process of getting warm water into our showers and sinks accounts for nearly 20% of the average home's energy use. Water heaters are unfortunately sneaky appliances, secretly accounting for almost 20% of our home's energy use. This amounts to hundreds of dollars each year — all for an appliance that we tuck away in a basement or closet and rarely ever think of.

Considering traditional heaters are three to five times less efficient than those powered by heat pumps, that's a lot of energy — and money — I could be getting back. How will it save me money? On average, a heat pump water heater will save me \$330 a year in energy costs. Most cost more than traditional options, but you could (check it out first) get up to \$2,000 back in tax rebates. When everything's said and done, you'll have saved close to \$3,000 over the course of 10 years (doubt I'll live that long but you never know).

Unlike traditional water heaters, which typically generate heat from using gas or electricity, heat pump water heaters warm your water by capturing heat from their surroundings and moving it into the tank.

It's a strange-sounding process that yields some shocking results — by many estimates, these appliances are three to five times more efficient than traditional ones. It's similar to how standard heat pumps, which are surging in popularity in many states, can work to heat and cool homes way more efficiently.

If these devices sound high-tech, it's because they are. And they come with a matching price tag as well. The downside is that, upfront, they're typically more expensive than a traditional water heater (usually in the \$1,500 to \$3,000 range), but you'll earn back your investment and then some in savings.

When should I consider getting one? The short answer is: not until you need it. Water heaters can last for varying amounts of time, but conventional wisdom says it's worth making a change around the 10-year mark. Anything longer, and you'll run the risk of a pretty ugly household disaster (think 50 gallons of water or more

flooding out onto the floor).

Another tip I read.... keep an eye on your monthly energy bills. If your costs go up unexpectedly, it could be a sign that your water heater is struggling and is ready to be replaced.

TANKLESS WATER HEATERS



Another option is tankless heaters which are nearly a third more energy-efficient than traditional storage tank heaters, which means you can cut your bills and reduce your pollution footprint with an easy switch.

It'll cost in the ballpark of \$2,000 to buy and install a tankless water heater, but you'll be eligible for a \$600 tax credit and save up to \$110 a year on energy costs.

Water heating accounts for 18% of home energy use, and a tankless unit can yield energy savings of 30%. Over a full year, this translates to 450 pounds of CO2 for an average house.

So overall, I have options....which is a good thing, but my options may cost me just as much by the time I choose between gas or electric, tank capacity and flow rate, installation costs and overall water usage needed for one person. All these need to be considered and checked out and to make sure a tax rebate is available.

Oh the joys of owning a home and that's only ONE appliance I need to consider replacing!
