

The MN State Fair is fast approaching! This means the MN Lions Hearing & Vision Foundations will once again have an informational booth in the Education Building.

Visitors to the booth can receive information about both Foundations and about their work at the University of Minnesota. Visitors can also receive some free items, such as eyeglass cleaning cloths and earplugs, compliments of the Foundations.

Each MN District in the Multiple is assigned the task of staffing the booth during the entire run of the Fair. 5M7 has the following shifts to cover as assigned by the Multiple:


Our **Diabetes Expo** will be held on Saturday, October 11th from 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM at the

Minneapolis Convention Center, Hall E. It is billed as "everything you need to know about diabetes under one roof" including workshops, cooking demonstrations, fitness activities, free health screenings, an "Ask the Expert" area, and vendors offering the latest diabetes products and services. Last year nearly 8,300 people attended; we're expecting more this year.

As a Lion, you and/or your club can get involved in several ways: We invite you to come to learn more about diabetes.

- ⇒We need many day-of-event volunteers for this activity. Lions Clubs may want to volunteer as a club. Many clubs helped last year; by wearing their vests they gained more recognition for Lions Clubs and what they do in the community. Volunteer for a few hours (time slots are 8:15-12:00 PM or 11:30-3:15 PM) or for the entire day. Please contact me at 1-800-676-4065, ext. 6592 or at cschaefer@diabetes.org if you or a club would like to volunteer.
- ⇒Several areas outside of the Twin Cities worked on organizing buses to and from the Expo for members of their community. Clubs from several communities in your district could set up a bus route with several stops to pick up people. Work with your local clinics, hospitals, churches, etc. to get the word out. If you are thinking about having a bus please contact me at 1-800-676-4065, ext. 6592 or cschaefer@diabetes.org for more information. All people will have free admission to the Expo and there will be free bus parking at the Minneapolis Convention Center.

We appreciate the support we have received from Lions Clubs in the past and invite you now to see how that funding is helping people with diabetes.



Affordable Hearing Aid Program



I would like to explain the Affordable Hearing Aid Program from the MD5M Hearing Foundation.

A person needing hearing aids, who can't possibly afford them on their own, can approach a Lions Club for help. That Club then can contact a Trustee of the Lions Hearing Foundation. There is an application form that contains questions about the financial situation of the person seeking hearing aids; we also require the past two years income tax returns. With this information we can determine if the person qualifies financially. We also need to know if the person has insurance or Medical Assistance that will cover all or part of the hearing aids. We must separate *Need* from *Greed*.

The next thing that is needed is an audiologist that will work for Medical Assistance rates. The person needs the results of a hearing evaluation or test taken within the past year. The trustee will ask the person for some help in paying for the hearing aids and the Lions club to pay the rest of the expense. The hearing aids provided are refurbished by Starkey Labs and have a one year warranty. Starkey will not accept a personal check from the recipient, so they make out a check to the Trustee. The Trustee then waits for the check to clear the bank, then the Trustee makes out a personal check to Starkey and sends it in along with the check from the Lions Club that is made out to Starkey Labs. These two checks are deposited into the revolving account the District has at Starkey Labs. The list of hearing aids available for the audiologist to choose from is quite extensive. A good match can usually be made so the recipient gets hearing aids that will improve their quality of life.

The Hearing Foundation does not supply hearing aids Free of Charge under this program. The recipient and the Lions Club pay for them. Depending on the circumstances of the individuals hearing needs, the price is usually less than \$1000, and can be as little as half that. So, if your club is approached about help with hearing aids, contact one of the trustees of the Lions Hearing Foundation for help.
