Second Harvest Heartland Food Bank provides support to nearly 1,000 programs, food shelves, soup kitchens and shelters throughout a 59 county area of southern MN and western WI.

 \Rightarrow 85% of households are food insecure.

- 18% have a household member that has served/is serving in the military.
- ⇒69% have a household income of \$20,000 or less.

Health struggles in those households.

⇒35% have one member with diabetes.

- ⇒44% have one member with high blood pressure.
- ⇒81% cope with their food insecurity by purchasing cheap, unhealthy foods.
- ⇒63% have to choose between food and medicine.

Who makes up these households?

- ⇒68% had a member that worked for pay within last year.
- ⇒71% have to choose between food and utilities or transportation.
- ⇒96% have permanent housing.



⇒82% have high school diploma, GED or college; 35% have some college, certificate or licensure.
