The American Diabetes Association, Minnesota Area is currently planning our two largest programs of the year: Camp Needlepoint/Daypoint and our Diabetes Expo. I personally want to invite the members of your club to visit one or both of these programs this year.

Camp Needlepoint sessions are Sunday, August 16 to Saturday, August 22 and Sunday, August 23 to Saturday, August 29. Since registration and camper pick-up are the Sundays and Saturdays, we ask that you schedule a day during the week. The time at camp will include a tour of the camp facility, lunch with the campers and an opportunity to meet the medical staff, counselors and campers. Camp is located just south of Hudson, Wisconsin. Contact Susan Klimek at 763-593-5333, ext. 6591 or email sklimek@diabetes.org to schedule your visit. We ask that you not show up without first contacting us as we need to know who is on-site for the safety of the campers and staff.

Our Diabetes Expo will be held on Saturday, October 10th from 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM at the Minneapolis Convention Center, Hall E. It is billed as "everything you need to know about diabetes under one roof" including workshops, cooking demonstrations, fitness activities, free health screenings, an "Ask the Expert" area, and vendors offering the latest diabetes products and services. Last year over 8,300 people attended and we're expecting more this year. As a Lion, you and/or your club can get involved in several ways:

- We invite you to come to learn more about diabetes.
- We need many day-of-event volunteers for this activity. Lions Clubs may want to volunteer as a club. Many clubs helped last year; by wearing their vests they gained more recognition for Lions Clubs and what they do in the community. Volunteer for a few hours (time slots are 8:15 AM 12:00 PM or 11:30 AM 3:15 PM) or for the entire day. - Several areas outside of the Twin Cities worked on organizing buses to and from the Expo for members of their community. Clubs from several communities in your district could set up a bus route with several stops to pick up people. Work with your local clinics, hospitals, churches, etc. to get the word out. All people will have free admission to the Expo and there will be free bus parking at the Minneapolis Convention Center.

Lions, Lioness and Leos of 5M-7:

In July 2010, the Lions of Minnesota made the first payment of a \$3 Million commitment toward a fund to prevent blindness in infants and children. We are proud to report the final payment toward this fund was written at the end of June, thus completing this five-year commitment by the Minnesota Lions Vision Foundation, and all the Lions of Multiple District 5M, to this University of Minnesota initiative. All of the Lions, Lioness and Leos of District 5M7 are to be thanked for their generous donations and should take pride in their financial support toward this fund. Thank you once again for being the "Knights of the Blind".

At the recent MLVF Board meeting, an eight-year \$4 Million commitment was made to establish the Minnesota Lions Eye Surgical Center at the University of Minnesota-Twin Cities. This funding will be used to purchase equipment dedicated toward the training of doctors and the treatment of patients at the U of M's Department of Ophthalmology and Visual Neurosciences. The eye surgical center will open February 2016 at its temporary home in the new U of M Health Clinics and Surgical Center. Once a permanent location for the Eye Surgical Center is found, the equipment will be transferred to its new home. This financial commitment strengthens the partnership between the Minnesota Lions and the University of Minnesota, which will benefit all those who depend upon welltrained doctors and cutting-edge treatment for their vision issues.

Another cutting-edge treatment supported by your donations to the MLVF is the Argus II artificial retina. The MLVF Board had the pleasure of meeting in person Pastor Jim Kelm, the first implant recipient of the Argus II at University of Minnesota – Twin Cities Campus. Pastor Jim explained his history of vision issues, becoming associated with the project and spoke on how this new procedure has greatly improved his quality of life. It was amazing to hear the excitement in his voice when speaking about how his involvement with the Argus II testing will hopefully restore more complete sight in someone else years down the road. Besides Pastor Jim, the U of M has three other implant recipients of the Argus II already completed

and an additional four to eight potential patients in the preoperation process before implantation. By the end of the year, the University of Minnesota should be the nation's leader in Argus II implantation and that is all thanks in part to the generous donations of the Minnesota Lions.

Thank you Lions of 5M-7 for providing your updated lists of used eyeglasses, sunglasses, reading glasses and hearing aids collection sites your Club maintains. If you have any additions or changes to your list of locations, please provide them to us as soon as possible. If you are in need of collection site boxes, please let us know and we can get some to you free of charge. When collecting the used eyewear, please separate the eyewear from any cases they may be in. The Minnesota Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center (MLERC) does not collect the cases. We encourage you to recycle or donate the cases. The MLERC will take broken metal frames for recycling but not any plastic frames. They will also take loose lenses as long as they are protected and not scratched. The recent donation of used glasses at the MLVF Board meeting helped fill the latest semi-trailer being sent to the Wisconsin Lions for recycling. Congratulations to all for their help in sending well over 10 Million eyeglasses to the Wisconsin Lions Foundation Eyeglass Recycling Center. Your efforts will touch so many lives around the world by providing them better vision.

We are available for presentations at your upcoming Club or Zone meeting. We would love to share with you the latest news regarding the MLVF, the U of M's Department of Ophthalmology and Visual Neurosciences, the MLERC and all the projects and programs supported by the Lions of Minnesota. We also ask you to please consider making a financial contribution to the MLVF in support of the great work being done in helping prevent blindness and improve the sight of those suffering with poor vision. Please consider making a contribution to the Minnesota Lions Eye Surgical Center to help get this new campaign off to a good start! Your check should be made out to the Minnesota Lions Vision Foundation or MLVF and the cause you wish to support with your donation can be indicated in the memo portion of the check.

Dear U.S. Lion,

We are pleased to share that Lions Clubs International is extending the Involve a U.S. Veteran pilot program through June 30, 2016. This program waives the charter or entrance fee for U.S. Veterans joining a Lions club in the United States.

Eligible veterans include retired U.S. military personnel or honorably-discharged members of the Air Force, Army, Coast Guard Services, Marines, National Guard, Navy or Reserves. Those currently serving in the National Guard or Reserves are also eligible. Lions Clubs International will provide an entrance fee waiver of \$25 (\$30 for charter members) to qualified U.S. veterans that join a local Lions club.
