


Lions, Lioness & Leos,

WANTED: 5M7 2nd Vice District Governor candidate for 2016-17


We as Lions of District 5M7 are looking for someone to run for 2nd VDG for year 2016-17. You must have been a Lions Club President and Lions Zone Chair.

The inspectors gave the MLEB a 100% rating, which means they neither requested nor recommended any changes to their operations, policies, or procedures. The surgeon inspector commented that this was the bestrun eye bank he has inspected. Lions should all take pride in our well-run MLEB, especially since it has never been accredited for less than the full three years at a time.
